PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period covered by this report, the command has been employed in support of U.S. and allied Forces in the Danang and Chu Lai TACR's.

a. In the Danang Cantonment, all personnel are assigned to H&S and "D" Companies for administrative simplicity and manpower conservation. Work is continuing with the self-improvement program. The old orthopedic building has been moved to the Staff Non-Commissioned Officer berthing area. A request has been submitted to construct a new X-Ray

building on the vacant site. A request has also been submitted for the construction of one 20' x 64' structure to be able to bring the bed capacity to 180 which is the present authorized allowance, and two Quonsets to add to Operating Room and Intensive Care Unit space. An additional 10,000 gallon bladder type water tank has been added, increasing the reservoir capacity to 15,000 gallons. Additional plumbing is being accomplished to furnish the Hospital complex with a more adequate water supply.

b. In the Chu Lai Cantonment (1st Hospital Company) construction of three Butler buildings has been completed and these are occupied with Medical Supply, and Organic Marine Supply.

The surgical complex (including triage, X-ray, pre-op, operating rooms, laboratory, intensive care unit, and shock and debridement) was completed and occupied 8 April 1967. Some internal construction such as partitions, shelves, and sinks remains to be completed to afford optimal hospital efficiency.

Approval is obtained for construction of a central sterile supply quonset, three 20-bed wards, a patient shower and lavatory, and eight living huts. Construction on some of these is underway.

Water is now supplied from a nearby well, pumped into a 25,000 gallon tank on the hospital grounds and piped to the surgical complex, wards, galley, and showers.

1st Hospital Company is now OPCON to ADCON to 1st Medical Battalion. "B" Company, 1st Medical Battalion is now attached to 1st Hospital Company which provides augmented staff necessary to operate a four operating-room complex and 160 beds including the new intensive care unit. Augmentation of the T/O of 1st Hospital Company is still deemed necessary to provide adequate staffing of the three wards under construction.

The holding capacity has been established as 30 days as per III MF letter 16/jew 6320 dtd 21 April 1967. This hopefully will reduce in-country evacuation of patients within limitations of space and personnel to provide patient care while maintaining adequate reserve for mass casualties.

The surgical capacity (operating room, and shock and debridement) now is sufficient to handle a group of up to 40 or 50 mass casualties provided there is not an unusual distribution of casualties. The surgical capacity is somewhat limited, however, by the admitting and sorting (triage) capacity.

c. The operation of two separate semi-permanent hospital facilities at Danang and Chu Lai respectively, the operation of a Medical Support Team, presently in the field, the demand for maintaining readiness for deployment of additional detachments, and the requirement for providing replacements within the First Marine Division causes a serious strain on the personnel resources of this Command.

d. The Civil Affairs program is still progressing in both TMR's.
