PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During April 1969, the 1st Medical Battalion continued to execute its mission of providing medical support to the 1st Marine Division.
2. On 2 April 1969, one (1) C&C Platoon (Rein) of "A" Company returned to 1st Medical Battalion. The Platoon had been in OpCon of the 5th Marine Regiment at An Hoa since 8 March 1969.
3. On 27 April 1969, all patients hospitalized at 1st Medical Battalion were evacuated to NSA Hospital. The evacuation started at approximately 1300 and was completed by 1500. Additionally, approximately three hundred (300) 1st Medical Battalion Staff personnel were evacuated from the cantonment to 423rd Army Transportation Battalion. The evacuation was initiated and supervised by the 1st Medical Battalion Command personnel due to the exploding ordnance at ASF1 ammunition dumps. Approximately two hundred (200) Staff personnel (Navy and Marines) remained on the cantonment until the explosions subsided at 0730, 28 April 1969. During this time the Battalion continued to execute its mission on a limited basis. The Mess Hall and OR's suffered heavy damage from blast effects and the remainder of the cantonment suffered light damage. All damages to 1st Medical Battalion cantonment were in the process of being repaired by late afternoon on 28 April 1969 and involved 1st Medical Battalion utilities personnel, and the construction engineers of MCB-5. On 30 April 1969, the necessary repairs were completed and the Battalion was again in full operation.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 4 April 1969 - Maj/Gen SIMPSON, Commanding General, 1st Marine Division visited patients hospitalized at 1st Medical Battalion.
- 13 April 1969 - Dr. MacPherson made a DENCAP to St. Josephs Orphanage where he treated ten (10) patients and to China Beach Orphanage where he treated twentytwo (22) patients.
- 16 April 1969 - Rear ADM F.T. NORRIS, MC, USN, visited patients hospitalized at 1st Medical Battalion.
- 20 April 1969 - Dr. GASSMAN made a DENCAP to China Beach Orphanage where he treated thirtythree (33) patients.
- 26 April 1969 - HM2 Cresencio VALDEZ Jr. was presented the Navy Achievement Medal with Combat V, L/CPL Garry A. LOGAN was presented the Navy Achievement Medal with Combat V, and HM2 Everette R. DINTON was presented the Bronze Star Medal with Combat V. The three (3) awards were presented by the Commanding Officer, Capt. J.W. LEM.
- 27 April 1969 - Brig/Gen JASKILKA, Assistant Division Commander visited patients hospitalized at 1st Medical Battalion.
