NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Company "C" First Medical Battalion continues in its primary mission of mobile medical support to Division and Battalion operations. Personnel of Company C are maintaining and working medical and organic mount out blocks of B and D Company, in addition to Company C gear. It is currently the only fully operational Collecting and Clearing Company within First Medical Battalion.

Company C operates the 43 Area Dispensary and furnishes training support to Schoals Battalion. Medical and Organic mount out blocks are continuously being inventoried and replenished. Much improvement has been shown in organic block since augmentation of supply personnel.
