

Part II

Narrative Summary

S-2 INTELLIGENCE

- 1. During the month of December five Vietnames personnel were apprehended and turned over to the Mational Police. All were found to be civil defendants falling into one of two catagories listed below.
 - a. Impreper or no I. D. card
 - b. Illegal resident
- 2. Intelligence reports during this period centered around the Viet Cong plans to attack vital U. S. and RVN installations. There was an increase in VC propaganda leaflets found within the Danang Vital Area. Reports and incidents indicate that VC agents are active in Da Nang City. Infiltration into Hoa Vang District is considered a continuing event. An increase in enemy activity in the rocket belt has been reported by numerous sources. Reports still indicate the VC plan to conduct a coordinated attack on installations in the Da Nang Vital Area.
- 3. The following sites were reported as likely targets during the reporting period.
 - a. Da Nang Air Base. This remains the number one target.
- b. Da Nang City. This is to be the focal point of terrorist activity.
- c. I Corps Eridges and Cam Le Bridge. These bridges maintain a high priority on the VC target list due to their importance in logistical support of the I CTZ.

d. Other targets mentioned are Marble Mountain Air Facility, Refugee Camps, Naval Docking Facilities, U. S. and ARVN installations in Hoa Vang District and Da Mang Special Sector.

S-3 OPERATIONS/TRAINING

- 1. During the month this Battalien conducted 154 day and 184 night fire team patrols, 40 fire team night ambushes and established 110 fire team sized listening posts for a total of 488 small unit actions.
- 2. Standard Readiness Condition I was established during Operation Claxon. Standard Readiness Condition III was set once during the month.
- 3.A Baso Defense Conference for Danang Vital Area Tenant Units was conducted on two occassions this month. The purpose of these conferences was to coordinate the defense of Danang Vital Area Complex and to discuss mutual problem areas.
- 4. A briefing on the mission of the 1st Military Police
 Battalion was conducted for Major General J. G. Bouker USMC
 Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force Pacific Forward by LtCol
 T. R. HILL.
- 5. Dolta Company commenced augmentation of the Popular Force Dofonse Unit located at the Cam Lo Bridge on 22 December 1967.
- 6. Officers and staff noncommissioned officers attended classes on the following subjects: functioning, nomenclature, care and cleaning of the M-16 Rifle, Vietnameselanguage, Rifle Company Tactics (use of supporting arms), and Marijuana detection.
- 7. Eattalion GMS training was conducted in accordance with current directives to include technical training by MOS.
- 8. Orientation classes were conducted for newly joined personnel on 5 December 1967.
- 9. A M16Al Rifle Training Program was inaugurated and accomplished during the month of December.

S-4 LOGISTICS

1. Significant Events

a. A briefing was conducted for the Commanding General, Force Logistic Command on the Battalion's major logistic problem areas. Action has been initiated by Force Logistic Command to alleviate or to correct the existing problem areas.

2. Supply/Ordnanco. Combat essential equipment readiness is rated at 99%.

3. Communications

- a. A Battalion Tectical Net #3 was implemented during the reporting period.
- b. Combat essential equipment readiness is rated at 92.6%.
- c. A problem in obtaining batteries for the AN/PRC-25 exists.

4. Hotor Transport

- a. Combat essential equipment readiness is rated at 98 percent.
- b. A problem in obtaining through supply channels second echelon repair parts for the AN/MRC-109 exists.

S-5 CIVIL AFFAIRS

1. General


- a. Throe boxes of clothing were received from a Cub Scout pack in California which will be distributed to needy children in the TAUR.
- b. On 21 December, a Christmas party was given by the Battalien to thirty children from the Sacred Heart Orphanage. Gifts were distributed to the children, party snacks served, and Christmas carols sung.
- c. Marines from Company "D" who teach English at the Binh Khue Cam Elementary School attended a Christmas party given by the school on 22 December.

2. Education

- a. Company "A" and Company "C" are conducting English classes at Hoa Coung and An Khe Hai Elementary Schools. Company A's instruction is for elementary school students while Company D's instruction is presented to elementary school teachers. Additionally, Company "D" also teaches English to the students at the Binh Khue Cam Primary School.
- b. To aid the education program in the Danang Vital Area one-hundred school kits were distributed to the Xuan Hea Elementary School.

- a. Company "C" commenced a MEDCAP program for children of the Xuan Hoa Elementary School. One hundred twenty-five children have been treated and plans are for the program to continue.
- b. Two hundred bars of soap were distributed to the inhabitants of Xuan Hoa Hamlet.

4. Public Works

- a. Badly needed repairs to a school in Hoa Coung are being accomplished with aid from Company "A". Ten bags of coment have been used in the project and materials to complete the repairs have been requisitioned.
- b. Teachers and students of the Binh Khue Cam Primary School are painting the school office and store room. Paint materials are being furnished by Company D.
- c. Scrap lumber was provided several families of RVN personnel to make repairs to their homes.

5. Civic Action Training

- a. A Porsonal Response Orientation class was conducted for all newly arrived marines on 5 December 1967.
- b. The Battalion Personal Response Council conducted a meeting to discuss problem areas and possible solutions for the problems.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

- 1. TuDo newspapers were distributed at traffic control points and on patrols to the Vietnames populous.
- 2. Magazines and leaflets were distributed throughout the TAOR.
- 3. Throo thousand Tot oriented leaflets have been ordered for distribution during the Tet holidays.

- 2. The FLC Preventive Medicine Unit conducted a sanitary inspection of the Battalien area. No major discrepancies were noted.
- 3. Lt. D. R. FRANCIS MC, USNR, attached to Maintenance Battalien, began conducting daily sick call at the Eattalien Aid Station.
- b. New Developments: A renovation program of the BAS facilities has commenced.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 6 Dec 1967 Company "B" Reaction Force dispatched to Camp Tien Sha to investigate a report of small arms fire. Search of the area produced negative results.
- 10 Dec 1967 Company "C" received one round small arms fire in the vicinity of Coordinate BT 001775. Patrol dispatched to investigate with negative results.
- 11 Dec 1967 Company "B" dispatched a patrol to investigate reported small arms fire received by communication installations on Monkey Mountain. Negative results were obtained.
- The Dec 1967 Alert drill conducted by Base Defense Battalion Reaction Forces.
