PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

S-2 INTELLIGENCE

1. During the month of January, one (1) Chieu Hoi was apprehended in the vicinity of Ap Than Khe Hai hamlet (AT 983784), and was turned over to Danang Special Sector for interrogation. In addition, twenty-six (26) individuals were apprehended in Battalion operations and patrols. Of these, one (1) was confirmed as a VC Commo Liaison; twenty (20) were classified as Civil Defendants or innocent civilians. Civil defendants fell into the categories of draft dodgers, illegal residents, or were in possession of illegal or invalid ID cards. Five (5) individuals have not been classified at this time. All personnel apprehended were turned over to Danang Special Sector, Hoa Vang Sub-Sector, or 5th CIT for interrogation and appropriate civil action.

THE PROPERTY OF

- 2. The following arms/equipment were discovered by combined search/sweep/probing operations within the Battalian TAOR.
 - a. (4) M-26 Hand Grenades.
 - b. (300) Rounds of 7.62mm Ammunition.
- 3. The following areas were mentioned as enemy objectives within the Danang Vital Area this reporting period.
- a. Danang Airbase remains a priority target due to availability of tactical air support and vulnerability to rocket attack.
- b. Marble Mountain Air Facility remains a primary objective due to its capability for tactical/logistical support in USMC/ARVN operations.
- c. Other targets frequently mentioned were the Cam Le Bridge, the Sicovina Textile Factory, Hoa Vang Sub-Sector and the I Corps Bridge.
- d. It should be stressed that a substantial volume of intelligence states that the Winter-Spring Offensive, with Danang City and the targets mentioned above primary targets, will probably be launched in the near future, with a high possibility for the initial attacks beginning sometime near the TET Helidays.

S-3 OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

- 1. During the reporting period this command participated in numerous small unit operations, but sustained no major contact.
- 2. The Battalien conducted 323 day and night fireteam size patrels; 27 day and night squad size patrels; 359 fireteam size night ambushes; 352 squad size night ambushes and 15 plateon size operations for a total of 1076 small unit operations during the reporting period.
- 3. In addition to the small unit activities, the Battalion also conducted 6 company or multi-company size operations.
- 4. Battalion Officer's and SNCO's attended classes conducted on the following subjects: Technique of Military Instruction; Employment of Artillery in the Defense; III MAF/I Corps Intelligence Briefing; Mission of the 1st Recon Battalion.
- 5. Battalion CMS Training was conducted in accordance with current directives to include training by MOS and NCO Leadership training. Some training was cancelled due to operational committeents.

- 6. A Troop Orientation Class for 53 newly joined personnel was conducted on 7 January 1969.
- 7. Two (2) enemy rocket attacks were conducted against Danang during this reporting period.

S. LOGISTICS

1. Significant Events

- a. 1stLt M. J. KELLY reported to the 1st Military Police Battalion Headquarters for duty as S-4 Officer, relieving Captain J. H. HANSON, reassigned.
- Battalion and was assigned as the 1st Military Police Battalion Readmaster.
- c. Construction continues on the BAS Ennker. Future work includes the installation of water into the bunker.
- d. Battalion Supply has constructed a shed adjacent to the rear of the Battalion Armory for the cleaning of weapons.
- 2. Percentage of Combat Essentia! Equipment on Hand
 - a. Supply 95%.
 - b. Motor Transport 92%.
 - c. Communications 95%.

S.5 CIVII. AITAIRS

1. General

- a. The repair/remodeling project at Bo De Elementry School (AT 989780) is about 80% completed at this time. Building materials and about 25% of the labor has continued to be supplied from this Battalion. During this reporting period, 15 sheets of tin, 15 sheets of plywood, 10 1X4's, and 1 2X8 was delivered.
- b. One bag of fertilizer was delivered to the vegetable garden project in Anh Khe (AT 98)779).
- c. Five sewing machines were delivered to the Sicovina Textile Factory to begin sewing classes at the newly constructed meeting hall in Hoa Vang (ET 014725). They will begin the classes on 1 March 1969.

d. Eighty-five sheets of tin were delivered to the market place project in an Thuong (BT 049760). The market place project is 90% completed at this time.

2. Education

- a. Thirty-one hours of English instruction was given to 1870 students at Hoa Vag High School (BT 013728).
- b. Fifty-two school kits and rulers were delivered to the newly started classes in Da Me (BT 044729).
- c. Coloring books, games and books were delivered to the "Head Start" project in Da Me (BT 0/4/729).
- d. Fifty English-Vietnenese books and fifty school kits were delivered to Cam Bac Elementary School (BT 014717).

3. Public Health

- a. 1247 patients were treated during Med-Caps within the 1st Marine Air Wing Civic Action Area of Responsibility this month.
- b. 381 patients were treated during Med-Caps within Naval Support Activity's Civic Action Area of Responsibility this month.
 - c. Soap was distributed at all Med-Caps in this reporting period.
- 4. Welfero. One truck load of lumber was delivered to a woman at Binh Thai hardet (BT 013724) for the reconstruction of her home that was destroyed during the last August enemy offensive.

5. Civic Action Training

- a. A total of six hours and fifteen minutes of Personal Response instruction was given to 361 members of the Battalian during the month of January.
- b. The Civil Affairs Officer gave Personal Response instruction in the Battalion Troop Orientation Class which was held on 7 January 1969 for all newly joined personne.

- 2. 425 Historical Posters were distributed throughout the TAOR this month.
- 3. 300 Safe Conduct Passes were distributed throughout the TAOR this month.

MEDICAL AND MENTAL

- 1. Pattelion Aid Station Chronological Pata
 - a. Spanificant Events
- (1) The Commanding General, Force Eggistic Command held a grounds inspection on 20 January 1969.
- (2) A Medical Inspection Team from MLC conducted an inspection of the Battalion Aid Station and it?s records.
- (3) A total of 1628 Vietnamese were treated through the Battalion Mcd-Cap program during this reporting period.
- (4) FMU from FLC conducted a sanitation inspection this month and discrepancies were light.
 - b. New Davelopments. Nonc.
 - c. Problems Encountered
- (i) Lack of emergency electricity causing biological medicanals to be of no value after 48 hours without refrigeration.
- (2) All personnel requiring suturing or routine lab work have to be sent to other facilities due to lack of lighting during a power failure.

 - a. Average daily number of patients seen: 28.
- b. Average daily number of patients referred to other treating facilities for consultations, dental, X-ray and lab work: 5.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

Danang as follows: Six (6) rounds impacted at MAG-16 west of the flight Line vicinity (BT 004738) resulting in ne casualties and slight damage. Three (3) rounds impacted between My Thi handet and MCB-12 vicinity (BT 055741) with one (1) of the three rounds landing on MCB-12's perimeter. No casualties or damage was reported.

At 021300H two (2) platoons from Company "C", 1st MP Battalion participated in a combined search/sweep operation in Ap Than Khe Hai hamlet from Route #1 north to vicinity of (AT 983784) with personnel from Danang Special Sector and Task Force Kilo. The operation resulted in four (4) Victnamese being detained and one (1) Chieu Hot.

7 January 1969: At 070400H one (1) plateon from Company "A", 1st MP Battalion accompanied three (3) plateons from the 106th RF Company on a combined search/sweep operation in Ap Bo hamlet (BT 027750). Five (5) VCS were approhended and were turned over to the 106th RF Company for appropriate action.

8 January 1269: At 080630H two (2) platoons from Company "B", 1st MP Eattalion with two (2) platoons of the 106th RF Company conducted a combined search/sweep operation in the hamlets of My Thi (BT 054743) and Khuo Bac (BT 058720). Five (5) VCS were apprehended (1 in My Thi and 4 in Khue Bac). Suspects were turned over to the 106th RF Company for interrogation.

14 January 1969: At 140930H a daylight patrol from Company "B", 1st MP Battalion apprehended one (1) VCS in My Thi hamlet (BT 054743). Suspect was turned over to 5th CIT who determined suspect was a VC Tax Collector.

15 January 1969: At 152300H an ambush from Company "B", 1st MP Battalion made contact with an unknown size enemy force at (BT 065715), resulting in one (1) UEMC WIA.

16 January 1969: At 160630H two (2) platoons from Company "B", 1st MP Battalion and elements of the 106th RF Company conducted a combined sweep operation in the harlet of Da Mo (2) (BT 065715). One (1) VC was apprehended and was turned over to 5th CIT for interrogation.

22 Jenuary 1969: At 220558H (13) 140rm rockets impacted on Danang Air Base as follows: three (3) vicinity of 1st MP Bat talion CP causing two (2) WIA (evac) ad no damage; five (5) vicinity of the 1st MAW causing ten (10) WIA and no damage; and five (5) vicinity of VQ-1 causing six (6) WIA and minor damage to one (1) aircraft.

The Semi-Annual Commanding General's Inspection was completed on this date and 1st MP Battalion was rated overall as Satisfactory with Minor Discrepancies.

30 January 1969: At 300650H two (2) plateons from Company "B", 1st MP Battalion with two (2) plateons from the 106th RF Company and 5th CIT conducted a combined search/sweep operation in the handets of Khue Bac (BT 058720) and Da Mo (2) (BT 065715). Three (3) VCS were apprehended in Da Mo (2). Suspects were interrogated by 5th CIT and then turned over to the 106th RF Company for further questioning.
