2. (C) S-2 Intelligence

- a. During the month of August, operations throughout the 1st
 Military Police Battalion TAOR included extensive patrolling and ambushes.

 These resulted in no significant, enemy contact. In addition, ten operation were conducted with our Vietnamese allies, which resulted in the detention of 119 Vietnamese Nationals and 4 US personnel. Among those being detained were 16 VCI, 48 Illegal Residents, 35 ARVN Deserters, 17 Illegal Papers, 3 VN curfew violators, 2 Army and 1 USNC UA and 1 US Naval personnel in off limits area carrying a private weapon.
- b. Intelligence reports indicated two "high threat" periods which did materialize to some extent in the form of terrorist activities resulting in killing of 2 VN civilians, the wounding of 3 VN civilians and the wounding of 4 US Army personnel. There were no attacks by fire during the reporting period.
- c. Current Intelligence Summaries indicate that the enemy will continue with terrorist activities, attacks against surrounding GVN units and concentrate on attacks by fire in the 1st M.P. Bn. TAOR, especially during the early part of September, when the lunar illumination is lowest and 2 North Victnemese Holidays occur on the 2nd and 4th.

3. (C) S-3 Operations and Training

- a. (U) The 1st Military Police Battalion participated in numerous company, platoon and smaller unit size operations during the month of August with no significant contact made.
- b. (C) During the reporting period, 133 fireteam size day patrols, 178 fireteam size ambushes, 74 squad-size day patrols, 85 squad-size ambushes, 31 river patrols and 31 squad-size combat outposts for a total of 532 small unit operations were conducted. In addition, 4 battalien size and 5 company size operations were conducted.





- c. (C) Joint Merine and Vietnamese Military Worces conducted 409 small unit operations within our area of operation.
- d. (U) Officers and Staff Hon-Commissioned Officers of the Battalion attended classes on the following subjects.
 - (1) Opportunities through Education
 - (2) Command Information/S-2 Brief
 - (3) The Economy and You
 - (4) Religions Based Customs in Vietnam
- e. (U) The Battalion Initial Indoctrination was cancelled for August due to the low amount of incoming personnel. This will be rescheduled for September.
- f. (U) CMS training was conducted in accordance with current directives to include training by MOS and NCO Leadership training. In addition, special Familiarization Firing and Cas Chamber Exercises were conducted for all Officers and SMCO's of the Battalion. Some training was cancelled due to operational committments and preparation for the CO's inspection on the 1st of September.

- (1) Extensive preparation was conducted for the Commending General's Inspection and for the upcoming monsoon. This includes area road fill and grading, painting buildings and barrels, etc...




- 1. At 010845H Aug 70, III MAF CID/Queng Da reported that a pack of explosives had exploded at #4 Dong Kinh Nghia Thuo Street (BT 030790) killing 2 VM civilians and wounding 2 VN civilians.
- 2. At 012015H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported that bunker 19 (BT 001776) received one round SAF from an Army 6x6 traveling along QL-1. Round impacted east of bunker 17 with negative damage or casualties.
- 3. At Oh2O3OR Aug 70, "D" to. reported that SAF was seen fired at airdraft while taking off from DAB, (BT Ol3725). How Veng notified of incident and asked to investigate.
- h. At 082015H Aug 70, 366th Security reported that a jeep from 37th Signal Company, at BT 032760, had an explosive device thrown at it but missed. As vehicle speeded up to get away it took ll incoming rds. of M-16 fire. One man seriously injured and one man slightly injured, the third man received no injuries.
- 5. At 082155H Aug 70, Armed Forces Police reported that a unit responding to a call by C.C.'s at 28 Hung Vuong St. received small arms fire. One AFP wounded and one Army servicemen driving an Army 6x6 was also wounded when an explosive device was thrown at his vehicle.
- 6. At 082330H Aug 70, "C" Company reported Bunkers 24 & 25 (BT 013773) took 3 rds. incoming SAF from BT 017774. No one was injured.
- 7. At 091801H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported bunkers 3 and 4 AT 993765 received SAF from treeline. "C" Co. swept area with a platoon with negative results.
- 8. "B" Co. 1st M.P. Bn. held a joint cordon and sweep of My Thi Hamlet (BT 055746) with 1 platoon and 10 National Police from Hoa Vang District Headquarters. "B" Co. was reinforced by a 20 man platoon from Army Support Command Denang. Results: 11 VN Civilians apprehended as illegal residents and 3 military personnel (1 USMC & 2 Army) turned over to AFP's as being UA.
- 9. At 101630H Aug 70, "B" Co. reported that patrol BP 1-1 had one Marine missing and presumed drowned in the Song Han River (BT 061723) at approximately 1405. Immediate steps were taken by 1st Eng. Bn. to try and recover missing Marine with negative results. Helicopters and diving teams utilized, and a skimmer boat operating in area during the hours of darkness to try and recover Marine. Search will be resumed at first light with boats dredging and units searching river banks.

- 10. At 102350H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported bunkers 24, 25 and 26 received two 30 rd. burst of N-60 fire from an Army 6x6 proceeding North along Duy Thon Hospital Road. Vehicle turned west onto QL-1 and proceeded in a westerly direction. Fire was not returned by bunkers.
- 11. At 111430H Aug 70, the body of missing Marine referred to in Thumber 9 Was found in the Song Han River (BT 061723).
- 12. At 112155H Aug 70, "C" Co reported that bunker #25 (BT 014772) received 8-9 rounds SAF from BT 018772. A pop-up was fired from BT 018772 at the same time. No one was injured.
- 13. At 112215H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported that Bunker #25 received 1 rd. SAF from BT 018772. No one injured.
- 14. At 112345H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported that Bunkers # 22 and 23 (BT 012777) received 7 rounds SAF from BT 018772. No one was injured.
- 15. At 122055H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported that bunkers #17 and 18 (BT 004779). Received 15 rounds SAF from BT 001779. Negative damage or casualties.
- 16. At 120400H Aug 70, A combined cordon & sweep by elements of 1st MP Bn. and the 523rd RF Company in the hamlet of Ap Bon 2 (center of mass BT 034738). Cordon forces consisted of "D" Co, 1st MP Bn., HAS Co. 1st MP Bn. River Patrol Boat 1, and two boats from Coastal Surveillance Group. Sweep forces consisted of 1 squad from "D" Co. 1st MP Bn. and the 523rd RF Company. In addition, 1 patrol vahicle from Armed Forces Police and 6 MP's from 1st MP Bn. provided traffic control. Approximately 200 detainess were treated in a joint VN and 1st MP Bn MEDCAP.
- 17. "C" Co. in conjunction with National Police, QC's, M.P. Co. 1st MarDiv and Armed Forces Police established roadblocks at AT 987775 and AT 992778 between the hours of 122200H Aug 70 and 122400H Aug 70. Results of the readblocks were 9 Military and 16 civilian personnel apprehended.
- 18. At 132045% Aug 70, "C" Company reported that 8-12 tracer rounds were fired at an aircraft taking off from DAB. The rounds were fired from the North end of the air strip but an approximate grid couldn't be established.
- 19. At 132230K Aug 70, MAG-11 reported that they apprehended 2 Q.C.'s for breaking into the 1st MAN Staff Judge Advocate's Office (AT 999759). The Vistnamese three two rolls of mency away totalling \$100.00 MPC and \$80.00 greenback. List VMF Q.C.'s and MAG-11 is holding the money until the incident can be further investigated.



20, At 170130H Aug 70, a combined corden and sweep by elements of 1st M.P. En. and Hoa Vang District Headquarters was held in the hamlets of Chua Ong and Nghia Hoa (center of mass BT 018730). Corden forces consisted of "D" Co. 1st MP Bn. and sweep forces consisted of two squade from "D" Co. 1st MP Bn. and forces from Hoa Vang District Headquarters. Results: 3 VN Civilians apprehended and 1 VN Civilian detained with false papers.

- 21. At 172302H Aug 70, "C" Co reported SAF at aircraft from MT 999775. Negative damage or casualties.
- 22. "C" Co. in conjunction with National Police established roadblocks at BT 013779 and BT 014768 between the hours of 192200H Aug 70 and 192400H Aug 70. Results: 3 VN civilians apprehended as cufew violators.
- 23. At 210h30K Aug 70, a combined cordon and sweep was held in the hamlets of Trung Lap/Trung Binh (center of mass BT 01777h) by elements of 1st MP Bn. and Danang Special Sector. Cordon forces consisted of KMS Co. reaction platoon, "D" Co. and "C" Co. 1st MP Bn. and MWHG-1 reaction company (Zulu 1). Sweep forces consisted of 1 RF Co, 1 PF Platoon, 2 Platoons National Police Field Forces, 30 National Police and 10 QC. Results: 1,577 VM personnel apprehended and checked; with 3 VN civilians detained as VCI (2 local cadre 1 cadre of District Committee) 8 illegal residents, 2 illegal I.D., 32 ARVM deserters, for a total of 45 VN personnel detained at Danang Special Sector Headquarters.
- 24. At 221010H Aug 70, BP 1-1 while on a daytime patrol detonated a SFD while moving up the Eastern tip of Razor Back (BT 065711). SFD was identified as an M-26 Frag Grenade. Two USMC WIA (emergency medevac).
- 25. At 221945H Aug 70, MAG-16 Main Gate received SAF from BT 055745. During this period of time Camp Adiner also received SAF. Movement was seen and illumination was utilized. 1st MP Bn. cordoned off area with HAS Co. reaction platoon, "B" Co. and Bn. CP Group. Area swept from BT 054745 to BT 062725 with negative results. Operation secured 230315H Aug 70.
- 26. At 222000H Aug 70, "B" Co. 1st MP Bn. held a joint corden and sweep of De Ma 2 (BT 064717) with 1 plateon and 4 National Police from Hoa Vang District Headquarters, and 2 mine sweep teams from 1st Eng. Bn. Results: 6 VN Civilians apprehended as illegal residents.
- 27. At 222030H Aug 70, MP-1 (river patrol) received 6 rounds SAF (BM 043739). Megative ensuelation or damage.



- 28. At 222230H Aug 70, AFF's reported that two buildings in Denong City BT 038765 were 100% destroyed by satchel charges, planted in the buildings, with 1 PF WIA.
- 29. At 232120H Aug 70, one NSA Security Patrol while checking out a report of two imerican personnel in Nam The Village (BT 067823) recleved small arms fire, while checking out the area. 1 QC KIA, 1 Navy Personnel WIA, both members of security patrol. 9 American Military suspects were apprehended in a sweep of the area.
- 30. At 232055H Aug 70, Tongo Security reported 4 rds. SAF from AT 994740 fired at Bunker #2. Negative casualties or damage.
- 31. At 242100H Aug 70, "D" Co. reported that DA-2 had apprehended two VN civilians at (BT 021727) without any papers. Personnel taken to Hoa Vang District Headquarters and detained overmight for further questioning.
- 32. At 280615H Aug 70, 1st MAW reported that at 272000H Aug 70 a UHIE helicopter received approximately 30 rds 50 cal. tracer fire South of DAB. Negative damage or casualties.
- 33. Between 290330N Aug 70 and 291030H Aug 70, 1st MP Bn. with attachments held a joint cordon and search/raids with elements of Danang Special Sector and Northern Surveillance Group in the hanlet of Son Tra (center of mass BT 067818). Cordon Forces consisted of "D" Co. 1st MP Bn. MWHG-1 reaction company, MAN-Lik reaction platoon, 5th Comm. Bn. reaction platoon, platoon from Army Support Commend Danang and a platoon from Naval Support Facility. Search/Raid forces consisted of MP's from "B" Co. 1st MP Bn. 4 Sentry Dogs from NSF, 2 Scout Dogs from "A" Co. 1st MP Bn. and "C" Co. 1st MP Bn. Vietnamese Search/Raid forces consisted of National Police, National Police Field Forces, QC's, PF's and RF's from Danang Special Sector and VN Naval Personnel from Northern Surveillance Group. In addition representatives from 5th CIT were also present. Results: 759 VN personnel were questioned with 40 detainees. 16 VCI, 3 ARVN UA's, 23 Illegal Residents and 1 US Naval Personnel in off limits area carrying a private weapon.
- 34. At 292045H Aug 70, "C" Co. reported that approximately 40 rds. were surroyed in the air from PF Compound at BT 103779.
- 35. Between 292200h Aug 70 and 292400H Aug 70, "C" Co. 1st MP Bn. conducted readblocks at AT 9977h2. Units participating, "C" Co, "E" Co, 1st MP Bn. 1st MarDiv MF:s. ATP's, National Police and GC's. Results: 7 VN Civilians and 5 ARVHIS detained for Allegal papers, and 1 USMC turned over to 1st MarDiv FP's for improper trip ticket.



- 36. At 303020H Aug 70, 1st Div. F300 reported that a CH-46 medevac helicopter received heavy automatic weapons fire (BT 0669). Negative damage or casualties.
- 37. Between 302200H Aug 70 and 300400H Aug 70, "O" Co. conducted readblocks at BE 011779 and BE 013768, units participating, "C" Co, "B" Co. 1st MP Bn, AFP's, National Police, and QC's. Results: 2 VN Civilian for illegal papers.
- 38. At 311905H Aug 70, Tengo Security reported 1 rd. SAF fired at tower #2 from the vicinity of AT 996757. Negative casualties or damage.
- 39. At 312155H Aug 70, "C" Co reported a burst of automatic weapons fire from the approximate grid AT 993763. Negative casualties or damage.
