2. (C) S-2 Intelligence

- a. During the month of December, enemy activity within the 1st Military Police Battalion TAOR remained at a low level. There were several high threat rocket periods but only one attack occured. The attack came on 21 December at 2142. It consisted of one 140mm rocket which landed at BT220733 causing minor damage to a fence. Expected surges in enemy activity due to occur on several Communist holidays during the latter part of the month failed to materialize. There were no terrorist attacks within the Danang Vital Area during the month.
- b. Contact with the enemy was restricted to nine incidents of harassing small arms fire (SAF) and one boobytrap detonation. There were negative casualties and damage.
- c. Current intelligence estimates for the Danang Vital Area predict a continuing low level of enemy activity. The threat of rocket attacks will remain high, particularly during the early part of January when illumination is lowest. The enemy retains the power to launch rockets almost at will into Danang Vital Area. There are no indications at this time of an increase in terrorist activities.
- d. The S-2 office issued four security clearances and thirty-three authorizations for access to classified matter.

3. (C) S-3 Operations and Training

a. The 1st Military Police Battalion participated in numerous platoon and smaller unit size operations during the month of December with no significant contact made.








b. The Battalion accomplished; 119 fireteam size patrols; 120 fireteam size night ambushes; 58 squad-size day patrols; and 59 squad-size night ambushes, for a total of 356 small unit operations. Of the total small unit operations, 209 were combined USMC/GVN operations. In addition; 6 company size operations were held.

- c. The dog handler teams of Co. "A", 1st Military Police Batta-Vilian, are trained and utilized in four different roles. Dogs traaned for sentry work have a vigorous job of maintaining security for allied cantonment areas and installations. Sentry dog handler teams were employed in security for 11th Motors, 5th Marines, MACS-4, 2nd CAG, and of specific importance in a combination with Co. "B", 1st Military Police Battalion, in the protection of the American Consulate, Danang City. Scout dogs are trained essentially to alert combat patrols of imminent enemy contact. Steat dog handler teams were integrated into patrols of the 1st These 5th Marines, and 2nd CAG. Mine and boody trap as their name implies, are trained specifically in the detecof mines and tooby traps. The teams were employed with the sowing units: 1st Engineers, 5th Marines, 1st Marines, and 2nd All. Macijuana dogs are not attached to various units, but are t agreed and utilized by Co. "A" in support of units requesting ... Marijuana dog handler teams were employed in drug/contraband enrehes of Camp Baxter (U. S. Army) and 1st Radio Battalion, FLC.








- g. An MCI group enrollment course was set up in the 01 field to benefit all personnel involved. Other MCI courses were taken out by individuals in the Battalion, and at present there are 4 officers and 30 enlisted personnel enrolled in individual MCI courses.
- h. A program has been set up in conjunction with the 1st MAW by which the Battalion can send to 1st MAW personnel desiring to take the GED High School equivalency exam. In this program the Battalion is also to send sixteen people per week to take the exam.

(1) A revision of Company "B"'s wire system was accomplished. This entailed the installation of eighteen (18) miles of communication wire and an SB 222 switchboard.

- (4) One hundred-eleven (111) items of Battalion communications equipment were routed for repair through the Battalion Communication Maintenance Shop.




c. Public Health
