
- a. January memors of February there was another rise in enemy actively within the lat E.F. Battalion TaOR. Reports continued to emphasize the movements of more enemy units with rocket capacities y moving within the rocket belt and an increased likelihead of combined rocket and sapper attacks.
- b. Two ranket attacks were launched on the Daning Vital Area during the month. The first attack on 1 February at 0355 did considerable damage. Fower lines were knocked down, small buildings were destroyed and major damage was done to (2) C-130s. Nine (9) rockets were launched in total. There were five (5) casualties; one (1) VN woman KIA, and four (4) USN WIA. As a result of visual reconnaissance by the 11thet. Marines the lift-off site was plotted at AT909723.

- d. The second rocket attack came on 21 February at 0132 with seven (?) 122mm rockets impacting in the area. Minor damage was done to VN dwellings. One (1) C-130 was the array of the only caualty was one (1) USMC from Company "C" who fell from a tower during the attack.
- e. Reports indicate that enemy units with rocket capability are located from the Northwest to the southour area. There are no indications that their mission will be any different from the past.
- f. Terrorist and sapper attacks to the installations of the GVN are still a high probability. Enemy small arms fire and granades (M-79) have been received by units working near Marble Mountain (vic BT075710) and at the Torowhen West in the 18068 705); The enemy's intentions sappears to be of the chassing in a turn.
- g. Fresently the S-2 office is undergoing a changeover in all personnel.

a. The 1st Military Police Battalion participated in numerous platoon and smaller unit size operations during the month of February with no significant contact made.
