
2. (C) S-2 INTELLIGENCE

a. During the month of March there was a rise in enemy activity within the lat M.P. Battalion TAOR. Intelligence reports continued to emphasize the movement of enemy units with rocket capability moving within the rocket belt and an increased likelihood of combined rocket and sapper attacks.










- b. Reports were received of female VC operating in Danang in the role of prostitutes with the intention of spreading VD to American and Korean Officials. These VC were also reported to have been carrying small weapons with the intention of assassinating clients.
- c. C-4 charges in soda cans were placed in two lst MAW vehicles and a female VC sapper was apprehended attempting to place a charge in another jeep at vic BT022761. She was part of a cell of VC females 15-18 years old operating in Danang City with the mission of destroying GVM and FWMAF vehicles.
- d. The threat of stand-off attacks by fire against the Danang vital area, especially Danang Air Base, remains high. Within the Battalian TAOR the enemy is expected to continue his harrassment and terror campaign at the same level it has been for the past several months with a possible increase in enemy activity in the vicinity of Marble Mountain (vic BT075709).

3. (C) S-3 OPERATIONS AND TRAINING


- a. The 1st Military Police Battalion participated in numerous platoon and smaller unit size operations during the month of March with no significant contact made.
- b. The Battalian accomplished: 84 Fireteam-size day patrols; 159 Fireteam-size night patrols/ambushes; 57 Squad-size day patrols; 4 Squad-size night patrols/ambushes, for a total of 304 small unit operations. Of the total small unit operations, 35 were combined USMC/GVM operations.
- c. Dog operations during the month of March were downgraded as the result of the continued stand-down operations of 1st Marine Division Units.
- d. Officers and Staff Non-Commissioned Officers of the Battalion attended classes on the following subjects:
 - (1) Moral Leadership.
 - (2) Drug Abuse.
 - (3) Command Information; S-2 Brief.
 - (4) Fam Fire Organic Weapons.






- c. Three Battalian Troop Orientation classes were held on 5 March, 22 March and 23 March for all newly joined personnel. The purpose of this day long class is to inform the personnel of the Battalian's mission in order to make them aware of problems they may encounter while serving in RVM. Topics covered in the orientation are:
- (1) Introduction and welcome by the Commanding Officer, including the broad picture of our mission.
 - (2) Briefs by the S-1, S-2, S-3, and S-5 Officers.
- (3) The nature of the enemy, handling of classified materials, rocket attacks, and black market activities.
 - (4) Personal Responsibilities.
 - (5) Veteran's Benefits.
 - (6) Career Planning.
 - (7) Legal Matters.
- (8) Code of Conduct, Geneva Convention, Rules of Engagement, and Weapons Safety.
 - (9) Vehicle Safety.
 - (10) Health and Hygiene.
 - (11) MBC Brief and CS Perception Exercise.
- f. Essential Subjects Training was conducted in accordance with current directives with Technical Training for MOS's not organic to the Battalian also being conducted. 59 hours of training was accomplished.
- g. The Officers and Staff Mon-Commissioned Officers of the Battalion were given four hours of training at the weekly Officers and Staff Mon-Commissioned Officers School.
- h. Personnel were sent to FLC for a Drug Abuse Education Team lecture.
- i. GED and GCT testing are continuing under the supervision of the Battalion Education Officer. March results: High School GED 10; College GED 0; GCT 0.







- j. At the end of the reporting period 55 personnel were enrolled in USAFI Courses and 122 personnel were enrolled in MCI Courses.
- k. During the month of March, 7 reactionary drills were conducted utilizing the reaction units of the 1st Military Police Battalion and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing. The average reaction time was 19 minutes.

- (1) A total of 74 pieces of Battalian Communications equipment were repaired in the communication maintenance shop or routed for repair to 1st FSR electronics maintenance.
- (2) A total of twenty-nine vehicle mounted radios were repaired.
- (3) During the month of March all of the field wire lines on the Company "C" perimeter were replaced.
- (4) Bunker Thirty-Six was wired into the Company "D" Command Post.





5. (U) S-5 CIVIL AFFAIRS

a. General

- (1) Civil Affairs personnel passed out some and leaflets in conjunction with Medcaps and Cordon and Search operations.
- (2) Three solatium payments in the amount of \$12,000 (VII) were made this month.
- (3) Two tons of paper, 682 board feet of lumber, 600 feet of screening and assorted office supplies were donated to Hoa Vang High School.
- (4) Approximately 20 pounds of vegetable seed and 50 sets of childrens clothing were distributed during Medcaps.

b. Education


- (1) Three personal response classes were conducted by S-5 personnel.
 - (2) Six man-hours were expended for education.


c. Public Health

- (1) During the month of March, 698 Viotnamose civilians were treated during Nedcaps: 249 males; 226 females; 223 children under the age of 13.
- (2) Modeaps were conducted in Cam Bac, Thanh Khue, Khue Trung I, II, III and IV and Ha Trung Hamlets.
- (3) Dentcaps were held in Thanh Khue, Khue Trung IV, Cam Bac and Ha Trung Hamlets. 148 people were treated.
- (4) 45 pounds of somp were expended in support of public health in the Danang Vital Arca.
- (5) 980 man-hours were expended in support of public health in the Danang Vital Area.


(4) 405 man-hours were expended in support of PSYOP activities.

g. Foreign Claims Investigation Office

- (1) FCI Teams investigated 15 accidents/incidents during the month. Three of these accidents/incidents resulted in Vietnamese fatalities.
- (2) Forty-four accident/incident investigations were completed and submitted to Foreign Claims Commission 413.
- (3) Average length of time for an investigation from notification to completion is 12 days.
- (4) A total of 1,570 man hours were expended in support of Foreign Claims Investigation activities.

6. (C) WAR DOG OPERATIONS

a. There are currently 57 dogs employed by 1st M.P. Battalion including:

c. Results of Dog Deployments

- (1) Scout dogs detected two booby traps, four bunker and tunnel complexes, six base camps, three weapons, three chicon grenades, one enemy subush site, one LF/OF site, one 105mm artillery round, and one belt of 7.62mm ammunition.
- (2) Sentry dogs detected three "Toepopper" surprise firing devices, one 105mm artillery round, two 81mm mortar rounds employed as surprise firing devices, two bunkers, and two roles of claymore wire.
- (3) Hime and booby trap dogs detected one surprise firing device and a large tunnel complex.
- (4) Marijuana dogs detected numerous bottles of obesitol, 462 marijuana cigarettes, three vials of heroin and 51 pounds of marijuana.

7. (U) MILITARY POLICE OPERATIONS

a. Armed Forces Police Detachment

- (1) Apprehended 220 individuals for miscellaneous violations.
 - (2) Investigated 45 vehicular accidents.
 - (3) Conducted 117 commodity control investigations.
 - (4) Conducted 24 raids.

b. Stockade Detachment

(1) There was an average of 57 USMC prisoners and no USM prisoners in the stockade this month.





- There was an average of 30 USMC correction personnel assigned to the stockade.
- (3) As a result of continuing stand-down operations of Marine units, the brig population has begun to draw down reflecting the transfer of confinees to correctional facilities in Conus.

c. Military Police Detachment

- (1) Five convoy/security escorts were provided to USMC units in the Danang Area.
- (2) A speed deterrent operation from 20-31 March 1971 resulted in the issuance of 56 speeding citations.
- (3) Roadblocks/checkpoints were manned throughout the Danang Vital Area employing two (2) M.P.'s, one (1) National Policeman and one (1) Interpreter. 55 U. S. servicemen were apprehended attempting to enter off limits areas.
- (4) Day and night patrols were run in the area to the west of Gate 12 (vic AT995747) resulting in the apprehension of eight (8) U. S. personnel who were off limits. These patrols measureably diminished the flow of illicit narcotics and appreciably curtailed prostitution in the
- (5) Security was provided at all Air Base Gates open to traffic.
- (6) Traffic control points were manned along the main arteries and at the major intersections around the Taneng Air Base to insure the orderly flow of Military traffic during retrograde operations.







- 9. (U) At 061900H Mar 71 LOC, VN P.F., was shot and killed by members of Co "R", 2/1 after he disregarded an order to halt by running his Honda through a road block (vic BT072711). LOC's Honda suffered minor damage. Notified III MAF Claims.
- 10. (U) At 072000H Mar 71 Sgt HAMILTON, operating a M151Al jeep, turned in front of Duoc, VN, who was riding a Honda motorcycle and struck him (vic BT029648). Minor injuries to Duoc and major damage to his Honda. A III MAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene of the accident.
- 11. (U) From 111900H Mar 71 to 112130H Mar 71, 3-5, lst M.P. Battalion, assisted by G-5, lst Mar Div, with security provided by Co "D", lst M.P. Battalion, showed four films for two hours at the Hamlet of Cam Bac, (center of mass BT015720) 1500 Vietnamese attended. In addition, 2400 leaflets were distributed and an armed propaganda team broadcast to the Vietnamese after the film.
- 12. (C) At 112245H Mar 71, 1 rd SAF was observed fired at approaching aircraft (vic BT009779). Negative damage, negative casualties.
- 13. (U) At 121300H Mar 71, Co "C", let M.P. Bn held a Medcap in Ap Ha Trung Hamlet (vic AT993787), treating 67 VM.
- 14. (C) At 122140H Mar 71, Co "C", miported 3-4 rds SAF impacted on bunker 74 (vic BT015770). Negative damage, negative casualties. Notified III MAF.
- 15. (U) Between 131300H Mar 71 and 131615H Mar 71, members of S-5 assisted by personnel from BAS, 1st M.P. Bn., a dentist and assistant from 95th Evac and a security squad from Co "D", 1st M.P. Bn., conducted a combined Medcap and Dentcap in the hamlet of Khue Trung IV. 125 VN civilians were treated in the Medcap and 70 VN were treated in the Dentcap. 450 PSYOPS leaflets and 201 lbs of soap were distributed.
- 16. (C) At 132145H Mar 71, a patrol, CPl, from Co "C", lst M.P. Bn., received 3-5 rds SAF (vic BT004773). Negative_damage, negative casualties. Notified III MAF.
- 17. (C) At 132230H Mar 71, Co "C", 1st M.P. Bn., reported bunker 64 (vic BT003777) and bunker 65 (vic BT003778) received 4 rds SAF. Negative damage, negative casualties. Notified III MAF.
