

2. (C) S-2 INTELLIGENCE

a. During the month of April there was a steady increase in enemy activity throughout the 1st M.P. Battalion TAOR.

b. An increasing number of reports emphasized the continued movement of enemy rocket and sapper units south and southwest of Danang Air Base. Reports also indicated enemy sapper units were sighted closer to the Danang Vital Area than the previous month, making ground probes by these units from without as well as terrorist activities by units from within a high possibility.

c. A high threat period was established from 24 April to 28 April, but was extended to 2 May.

d. The threat of stand-off attacks against the Danang Vital Area remains high. The enemy is also expected to concentrate their efforts in launching such attacks on the Danang Air Base, West Danang Heliport and ammo and fuel dumps within the area.

3. (S) S-3 OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

a. The 1st Military Police Battalion participated in numerous platoon and smaller unit size operations during the month of April with no significant contact made.

b. The Battalion accomplished: 103 fireteam-size night patrols/ambushes; 15 squad-size night patrols/ambushes, for a total of 198 small unit operations. Of the total small unit operations, 35 were combined U.S.C/CVN operations.

✓ c. Dog operations during the month of April were down-graded as the result of the continued stand-down operations of 1st Marine Division Units.

d. Officers and staff Non-Commissioned Officers of the Battalion attended ~~all~~ class on the following subject: Personal Response.

e. Essential Subjects Training was conducted in accordance with current directives.

f. GED and CCT testing are continuing under the supervision of the Battalion Education Officer. April results: High School GED - 20; College GED - 0; CCT - 0.

5. (1) B-5 CIVIL AFFAIRS

a. General

- (1) Civil Affairs personnel passed out soap and leaflets in conjunction with Medcaps and Cordon and Search Operations.

- (3) One-half ton of paper and 200 English books were donated to Hoa Vang High School.

7. (C) MILITARY POLICE OPERATIONS

a. Armed Forces Police Detachment

(3) As a result of the continuing stand-down operations of Marine Units, the brig population has continued to draw down reflecting the transfer of confinees to correctional facilities in CONUS.

c. Military Police Detachment

(1) Seven convoy/security escorts were provided to units in the Danang Area.

(2) A speed deterrent operation from 21-28 April 1971 resulted in the issuance of 23 speeding citations.

(3) Roadblocks/checkpoints were manned throughout the Danang Vital Area employing two (2) M.P.'s, one (1) National Policeman and one (1) Interpreter. 20 U.S. servicemen were apprehended attempting to enter off limits areas.

(4) Day and night patrols were run in the area to the west of Gate 12 (vic AT 995747).

(5) Security was provided at all air base gates open to traffic.

(6) Traffic control points were manned along the main arteries and at the major intersections around the Danang Air Base to insure the orderly flow of military traffic during retrograde operations.

8. (C) SECURITY OPERATIONS

a. United States Consulate Detachment

(1) Throughout the reporting period 12 personnel from 1st Military Police Battalion provided continuous security for the American Consulate Compound.

(2) The Security Force was augmented during the hours of darkness and in high threat periods with the use of two sentry dog teams and additional personnel as needed.

b. III MAF Security Detachment. During the reporting period a provisional rifle platoon from 1st Military Police Battalion provided security for Headquarters III MAF, Camp Haskins (center of mass AT 953812).

1. (C) At 012030H Apr 71, received a call from Division CCC that U.S. Helicopters were taking S.A.F. (vic AT 999708) near Cau Do Bridge. Notified Co "D", 1st M.P. Bn, III MAF, and Hoa Vang District.
2. (C) At 012130H Apr 71, 366th SP reported ASP-1 (vic AT 993735) received S.A.F. Negative damage, negative casualties. Notified III MAF.
3. (C) At 012130H Apr 71, Co "C" reported bunker 69 (vic BT 009774) received (3) rds S.A.F. No impacts, no casualties. Notified III MAF.
4. (C) At 012140H Apr 71, Co "D" reported bunker 29 (vic BT 005733) received 8-10 rds S.A.F. from the village across from the bunker. Negative damage, negative casualties. Notified III MAF, Hoa Vang.
5. (U) At 021200H Apr 71, Sgt PARKER, Hq Cc, 2/1 operating an H151A1 Jeep swerved to avoid a VN female on a bicycle and struck a Honda head on (vic BT 035774) resulting in minor injuries to the VN driver and moderate damage to the Honda. A III MAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.
6. (C) From 030400H Apr 71, to 030930H Apr 71, elements of Co "E", HQ MG-1, and P.F.s from Hoa Vang District HQ conducted a Cordon and Search operation in the vicinity of Binh Thai Hamlet (center of mass vic BT 012725). Negative results. Notified III MAF.
7. (C) At 030445H Apr 71, bunker 72 (vic BT 012772) received 8-10 rds S.A.F. from an unidentified individual (vic BT 014773) after the bunker guard challenged. Negative casualties, negative damage. Notified III MAF, 366th Security Squadron.
8. (C) 031130H Apr 71, CSGT TAYLOR from 7th Comm Bn, III MAF hit VN civilian (vic AT 953801). VN taken to Hoa Chanh Hospital. A III MAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Bn, was dispatched to the scene.
9. (C) At 032100H Apr 71, ASP-1 received 3-4 rds S.A.F. from (vic AT 960725). No rounds impacted. Negative casualties, negative damage. Notified III MAF, 366th Security Squadron.
10. (C) At 040215H Apr 71, a patrol from Co "C", found 10 Vietnamese dressed in black and carrying carbines in area

of bunker 71. Personnel were believed to have been firing at Co "C" bunkers. Vietnamese were turned over to the 504th I.P.'s and Q.C.'s for questioning. Notified III MAF and Hoa Vang District.

11. (C) At 042322H Apr 71, a dog team from 366th Security reported they received 2 rds SMF 50 meters south of bunker 73 (vic AT 017767). Negative damage, negative casualties. Notified III MAF and Hoa Vang District.

12. (C) At 050205H Apr 71, seven (7) 122mm rockets impacted on and around the Danang Air Base at (1) AT 001769 (back azimuth-2800 mils), negative damage, negative casualties; (2) AT 008771 (back azimuth-3000 mils), negative casualties, minor damage to Air Force F4 aircraft; (3) AT 004773 (back azimuth-2900 mils) negative casualties, negative damage; (4) AT 095752 (back azimuth-2700 mils), negative casualties, negative damage; (5) AT 993774, negative casualties, negative damage; (6) AT 993765, destroyed two VN houses, damaged one VN house and wounded 2 VN; (7) AT 999776, negative casualties, negative damage. Confirmed launch site located at AT 035667. Notified III MAF, Div FSOC, Div CCC, FLC CCC, Wing G-2, NAF, Hoa Vang, Danang Special Sector, 366th SPS.

13. (U) From 051300H Apr 71 to 051600H Apr 71, personnel from 1st I.P. Bn. (Co "D", S-5, B&S) conducted a medcap at the Phong Bac Hamlet school (vic AT 999713). 125 Vietnamese civilians were treated. A 4 year old Vietnamese girl was taken to the childrens hospital at ILC, was treated for a gum infection and released. Health and Sanitation leaflets were distributed.

14. (U) At 071000H Apr 71, PFC THOMAS, Hq, III MAF was operating a ½ ton truck on QL 1 and was struck by a VN on a Honda resulting in minor injury to the VN and major damage to the Honda, (vic AT 985778). A III MAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st I.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

15. (U) From 071330H Apr 71 to 071530H Apr 71, personnel from Co "C" conducted a medcap in the hamlet of Phu Loc (vic AT 983793). A total of 56 VN were treated.

16. (C) At 072115H Apr 71, U.S. VNMF advisors reported possible two (2) plastic explosive devices detonated near the VNMF compound, (vic AT 015764 & AT 013763). Follow-up reports indicated only (1) one confirmed explosion, just outside perimeter wire in ARVN Hospital, (vic AT 015764).

Latest report indicates one dead and 15 wounded. Negative enemy results. Investigation pending by VMAR. Notified 1st IAF, Hoa Vang, 1st Marine Air Wing and FLC.

17. (U) From 081545H Apr 71 to 082130H Apr 71, personnel from Co "B" conducted a PSYOPS in the hamlet of Mai Ham. PSYOPS films were shown to approximately 1000 Vietnamese and 1400 leaflets were distributed.

18. (C) At 090055H Apr 71, five (5) 122mm rockets impacted on and around the Danang Air Base at (1) BT 007763 (back azimuth-3400 mils), negative damage, negative casualties; (2) BT 027776 (back azimuth-3600 mils), 2 houses damaged (1 moderate, 1 heavy), 1 VN slightly wounded; (3) BT 032769 1 bldg heavy damage, 2 bldgs minor damage, 1 car, 2 trucks (civ) minor damage, 4 VN slightly wounded; (4) BT 027773 (back azimuth-3500 mils), 1 bldg heavy damage, 1 truck (civ) moderate damage, negative casualties; (5) BT 007779, negative damage, negative casualties. Suspected launch site located at AF 965667. Notified 1st IAF CCC, 1st MarDiv FSCC, CCC, 1st CCC, 1st I.P. Danang Special Sector, Naval Support Facility, Hoa Vang, 366th SPS, VMAR CCC, Army Support Command.

19. (U) At 091000H Apr 71, PFC MARTIN, HQ Btry 1/11 was operating a 5 ton truck on QL 1 when a VN ambulance attempted to pass and swerved in front of the truck causing the ambulance to turn over resulting in unknown injuries to the NVA driver and major damage to the ambulance, (vic AF 955790). A 1st IAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st I.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

20. (U) At 091235H Apr 71, 1st Sgt JOHNSON, 1st IAF, was operating an H51AL on QL 1 when he struck the rear of a VN bus resulting in minor damage to the rear of the bus, (vic AF 965775). A 1st IAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st I.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

21. (U) At 091300H Apr 71, LCpl GUNNING, Supply En., FLC was operating a 2½ ton truck on Highway 540 when his brakes failed resulting in a head-on collision with a VN truck resulting in minor damage to VN truck.

22. (C) From 091300H Apr 71 to 091615 Apr 71, elements of Co "B", 1st I.P. Battalion, Danang Special Sector and 5th CIC conducted a combined Cordon and Search Operation in the hamlet of Nam Thic (center of mass AF 066014). 570 individuals were screened and twenty-seven were detained,

including: 4 WOI (confirmed), 20 VCS, and 3 individuals with false documents. Further interrogation of detainees is being conducted by 5th CIT.

23. (U) At 120715H Apr 71, LCpl KLEINERTZ, Maint Bn., FLC was operating a 2½ ton truck on Highway QL 1 when he was sideswiped by an unidentified ARVN truck forcing his vehicle to strike a VN bus resulting in minor damages to the bus and three civilians with minor injuries, (vic BT 004779). A III MAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st R.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

24. (U) From 121300H Apr 71 to 121630H Apr 71, elements of Co "C", 1st R.P. Battalion conducted a Medcap in the hamlet of Phu Loc (center of mass AT 986790). 75 Vietnamese were treated for minor illnesses.

25. (C) At 131905H Apr 71, 366th Security Police Squadron reported loud explosion, vicinity bunker 19. Subsequent report from Co "D", 1st R.P. Bn. revealed VN had detonated mine in French mine field (vic BT 025735). VN evacuated by other VN. Injuries unknown at this time. US Air Force investigating. Notified III MAF, Hoa Vang.

26. (C) At 141200H Apr 71, III MAF stood-down and the Third MAF took over as the senior Marine command in VN.

27. (U) At 151100H Apr 71, Cpl HESTOR, Hqs Co, 2/1 was operating an M151A1 jeep on Highway QL 1 passing a VN truck when the VN truck swerved left and struck his jeep causing it to roll over resulting in major damage to jeep and minor damage to the two Marine occupants, (vic BT 008715). A Third MAF Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st R.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

28. (U) From 151330H Apr 71 to 151500H Apr 71, personnel from 1st R.P. Battalion, (Co "D", B-5, sub) conducted a Medcap in the hamlet of Khue Trung 1 (vic BT 019723). 80 VN civilians were treated. Clothes were distributed to about 35 VN children. Health and sanitation leaflets, Chieu Hoi, Pro-GVN, and anti-VC leaflets were distributed.

29. (C) At 151630H Apr 71, received a report of an explosion 350 meters south of post 9, near ABP-1, (vic AT 9-2726), believed to be two (2) cluster bombs. (U) At 160745H Apr 71, LCpl LARINIS, 1st Med Bn, was operating a 5 ton truck when an ARVN on a Honda attempted to pass, cut in too sharply and was struck by the front bumper of the truck resulting in minor damage to the Honda and negative injuries, (vic BT 015779). A Third MAB Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

31. (U) At 161430H Apr 71, LCpl SCOTT, Maint Bn., FLC, was operating a 3/4 ton truck on Highway QL 1B when a VN civilian on a Honda attempted to pass on the right. SCOTT swerved right to avoid on coming traffic and struck the Honda resulting in minor damage to the Honda and minor injuries to the VN driver, (vic BT 006776). A Third MAB Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

32. (U) At 170920H Apr 71, Cpl MELTZ, Maint Bn., FLC, was operating a 2 1/2 ton truck on Highway QL 1B when a VN civilian parked his Lambro on the shoulder of the road. When Cpl MELTZ attempted to pass the vehicle he struck the left side with his bumper resulting in minor damage to the Lambro and negative injuries, (vic AT 995779). A Third MAB Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

33. (U) At 181515H Apr 71, SGT KIRPLE, Co "A", 1st M.T. Bn., was operating a 5 ton truck on Highway 13 and swerved to avoid a suddenly stopping Army semi-trailer and struck the Army vehicle and a VN Lambro resulting in minor damage to the USMC truck and the Army vehicle, and major damage to the Lambro and minor injuries to two VN civilians, (vic BT 050809). A Third MAB Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

34. (C) At 182245H Apr 71, PFC CRUZ, Co "G", 1st M.P. Bn., was struck on the head by an unknown individual while walking rear point on a patrol, (vic AT 194778). Marine medevaced to 1st Med Bn. and held for overnight observation. Notified Third MAB.

A Third MAB Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. battalion was dispatched to the scene.

36. (U) At 230930H Apr 71, NGUYEN BAN was hit by a short round of 82mm illumination at AF 980690, minor injuries, negative damage. A Third MAB Foreign Claims Investigation Team from 1st M.P. Battalion was dispatched to the scene.

OPERATION ALPHA VII - 71

2 April 71

1. Situation. Hoa Vang District reports approximately 8 enemy sappers in the area shown on enclosure (1). It is believed that his mission is to create terrorist tactics around the DNA & ARVN Units; and to possibly penetrate DNA complex in near future. Hoa Vang has inaugurated a Cordon & Search Operation to curtail their activity.

a. Enemy forces

(1) Suspected enemy forces: Approximately 8 sappers in the vicinity of area shown; Encl (1).

(2) Past enemy intelligence: (S-2).

b. Friendly forces: One platoon of R.F.'s located at AT 998706 (Cau Do Bridge). One platoon of P.F.'s located at BT 008722. Friendly forces have been alerted by Hoa Vang.

c. Attachments: 70 Marines from Zulu Company MWHG1.

2. Mission. At 030400H April 71, 1st M.P. Bn will assist in Cordonning the area shown on enclosure (1), in preparation of a search being conducted by Hoa Vang personnel.

3. Execution

a. Co "B". At 030330, one platoon from Co "B", 1st M.P. Bn will depart the area to Gate 12. At Gate 12, they will meet and lead a reinforced platoon from Zulu Company, MWHG1 south along QL 1 to a road intersection located at BT 002723. At that point, Bravo Company Plt will Cordon off road running east from intersection for approximately 200 meters to be in place by 030400H.

b. Zulu Company. Zulu Company will simultaneously Cordon QL 1 south from intersection to small bridge (BT 000715) to be in place by 030400H.

c. Both Co "B" (-) and Zulu Co (-) will be under the overall command of CO, Co "B". In addition to their Cordon activities, they will (on call) assist and protect S-5 section in conducting hedcap operations.

d. Reserve - Co "B" Reaction Force will be on-call to deploy at the request of CO, 1st M.P. Battalion.

e. Coordinating Instructions

- (1) Zulu Co (1) will initially stage in their respective area, and arrive at Gate 12 no later than 030330H.
- (2) Company "B" (-) will stage in 1st M.P. Bn. area and depart at 030330H for Gate 12.
- (3) Company "B" (-) will depart from Gate 12 at 030330H, with Zulu Co (-) following.
- (4) CO, Co "B" (-) will:
  - (a) Confirm departure with COC.
  - (b) Report upon arrival at intersection.
  - (c) Report when Cordon is complete.
  - (d) Periodic reports every 20 minutes.
  - (e) Report when search operation is completed.

f. No magazines will be inserted in weapons until debarking from trucks at Cordon site, and then only on order.

- (a) No fixed bayonets.
- (b) No gas.
- (c) No round in chamber.

g. Cordon units return jointly and report to COC.

4. Administration and Logistics

- a. Uniform: Standard jungle utilities, including TO weapon, one (1) bandolier of ammunition, flak-jacket, helmet, gas mask.
- b. One ambulance and 2 corpsmen report to CO, Co "B" at 0315 and be prepared to move out at 0330.
- c. S-5 will follow convoy and move to detainee point separately.
- d. S-4 will provide 2 6x6's to carry Co "B" (-) personnel. These vehicles will report to CO, Co "B", C.P. at 030300H.
- e. S-4 will provide coffee and donuts at Cordon site by 030430H, and will provide appropriate breakfast rations.


