PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

First Motor Transport Battalion primarily performed routine logistic tasks within the Danang TAOR, and continued convoys from the Danang TAOR to An Hoa in support of the Vietnamese industrial complex located there.

During the period 6-8 April, the Battalion provided four convoys in support of "Operation Caynon" and provided one convoy on 21 April in support of "Operation Union".

On 11 April, authority was received from Division Motor Transport to place all 96 M35A2C's into service.

Utilizing 96% of the available trucks, a total of 100,925 miles was driven by the Battalion carrying 26,136 Troops and 4,114 ton of cargo.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 6 April 1967 - Convoy comprised of 38 trucks from "A" Company transported 191 tons of class I, II, IV, and V from 1stMTBn CP to Hoi An in support of "Operation Caynon".
- 6 April 1967 - Convoy comprised of 29 trucks from "B" Company transported 181,955 lbs of class V from 1stMTBn CP to Thrang Bihn in support of "Operation Caynon". One truck struck a land mine (Approx. 50 lbs TNT), vehicle was destroyed after determination that it could not be recovered. The driver was WIA and Med-Evacuated.
- 6 April 1967 - Convoy from "A" Company transported 320,500 lbs of fuel from the Danang TAOR to Hoi An in support of "Operation Caynon".
- 17 April 1967 - "C" Company re-joined 1stMTBn. "C" Company had been opcon to 7th MTBn in Chu Li since 14Feb67.
- 19 April 1967 - A "Rough Rider" convoy of 18 trucks from "B" Company transported 340,000 lbs of class II and IV from the 1stMTBn CP to Phu Bai, and returned the following day without incident.
- 19 April 1967 - Transport Co, 9thMTBn was detached from opcon 1stMTBn and returned to 9thMTBn in Dong Ha by "Rough Rider".
- 22 April 1967 - Convoy comprised of 15 trucks from "B" Company transported 300 Marines from 2ndBn, 1stMarines to Thrang Bihn in support of "Operation Union".
