PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

First Motor Transport Battalion primarily performed routine logistic task within the Da Nang TAOR, and continued convoys from Da Nang to An Hoa in support of the Vietnamese industrial complex located there.

Utilizing 98% of the available trucks, a total of 139,895 miles were driven by the Battalion carrying 92,137 troops and 5,930 tons of cargo.

On 12 June 1967 one (1) truck from a Company "A" Rough Rider hit a mine while returning from Phu Bai to Da Nang. The vehicle was destroyed. One (1) WIA resulted.

PART III
SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

12 June 1967 - A Rough Rider left Da Nang at 0800 and proceeded to Phu Bai carrying 275 tons of cargo and 245 troops from 1st Field Artillery Group. Convoy returned the following day with 330 empty oil drums for 7th Bulk Fuel. One truck hit a mine at Grid Coordinate 035026 destroying the vehicle and resulting in one (1) WIA.

17 June 1967 - Convoy from Company "B" transported 212 troops from First Battalion, First Marines CP to Song Thu Bon river in support of Operation BROWN.

22 June 1967 - Convoy from Company "A" transported 130 troops from Grid 060560 and returned them to Second Battalion, First Marines in support of Operation BROWN.

22 June 1967 - Two (2) M-76 Otters, TAD to Second Battalion, First Marines transported 420 troops across Song Thu Bon river upon return from Operation BROWN. Sniper fire was received but no casualties were sustained.

24 June 1967 - Convoy from Company "B" transported 450 troops from First Battalion, First Marines CP to Grid 070515 in support of Operation CALHOUN.

28 June 1967 - Convoy from Company "A" transported 1100 ARVN troops from Grid 058401 and took them to Grid 920530 in support of Operation CALHOUN.
