PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 1st Motor Transport Battalion performed routine combat logistical functions within 1st Marine Division TACR. The Battalion traveled 73,333 miles, transported 7,752 tons of general cargo and transported 50,617 troops. The 1st Motor Transport Battalion remains in support of the 1st Marine, 5th Marine, 7th Marine, and 26th Marine Regiments.

PART III
LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

There were no Combat losses of personnel or equipment for the month of June.

Non-Combat losses consisted of 10 enlisted and 1 Officer. 2 Enlisted were injured, while the remainder were evacuated for medical reasons other than injuries.

A total of 12 personnel from this Battalion availed themselves of the R&R program during the month of June.

Personnel rotated during the month of June was 1 Officer and 12 Enlisted men.

Replacements received for the month of June was 2 Officers and 26 Enlisted men.

During the month of June 2 personnel were recommended for the Bronze Star Medal, 2 recommended for the Navy Commendation Medal, and 3 for the Navy Achievement Medal.

Promotions for the month of June was 1 2ndLt to 1stLt, 1 E-7 to E-8, 2 E-4 to E-5, 12 E-3 to E-4, 25 E-2 to E-3 and 1 E-1 to E-2.

20 June 1969, General JASKILKA, Asst Division Commander, inspected the Battalion area.

Camp facilities under development at this time are the reconstruction of a foot bridge connecting the industrial area with the billeting area, blacktopping of motor pools and maintenance area, and procurement of fans for the enlisted living quarters.

A total of 12 Medcaps were held by this Battalion during the month of June 1969. 4 to Phuoc Thanh Orphanage and 8 to Dong Phuoc Village. Treatment was provided for 165 persons and 235 immunizations were given.

Twice during the month visits were made to FLC's Children's Hospital and pysops films were shown.

Materials supplied to Phuoc Thanh Orphanage and Dong Phuoc during the month consisted of, 11 truck loads of wood and roofing tin, 10 rolls of screening, and 200 pounds of rice and food stuffs.
