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





PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 1st Motor Transport Battalion continued its assigned combat support logistics functions within the 1st Marine Division TAOR. Its vehicles trawaled 92,463 miles, transporting 6,554 tons of general cargo and 57,690 personnel. The battalion remained in direct support of the First, Fifth, and Seventh Marine Regiments. The battalion provided direct support to the 26th Marine Regiment until their embarkation and subsequent departure on 11 March. Cargo and personnel movement convoys were also conducted by the battalion in support of these units.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS


During March the battalion sustained one (1) KIA and three (3) WIA evacuated of which two were returned to duty. Two (2) non-battle casualties were also evacuated.

A total of seventeen (17) personnel took advantage of the R & R program.


Four (4) officers and fifty-seven (57) enlisted personnel rotated to conus. The battalion received two (2) officers and thirty-four (34) enlisted personnel as replacements during the same period.

Recommendations for three (3) Bronze Stars, one (1) Navy Commendation, and two (2) Navy Achievements were made.

Two (2) promotions to E-5 and two (2) meritorious promotions to E-5 were made.

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A total of four (4) personnel were processed for discharge. One (1) received an Undesirable Discharge and three (3) were discharged for the Convenience of the Government.

On 1 March, Major General WHEELER visited the battalion presenting Company "A", 1st Motor Transport Battalion with a Meritorious Unit Citation. Lieutenant General MCCUTCHESON visited the battalion on 26 March, touring the maintenance shop and motor pool.


The attached Company "A" (Rein), 5th Motor Transport Battalion departed on 11 March for Camp Pendleton, California for deactivation.

During the month of March, 1st Motor Transport Battalion continued its routine mission of providing direct motor vehicle support to the 1st Division's Infantry Regiments. It also conducted seven (7) tactical and administrative resupply convoys in support of these units. Four (4) of the seven (7) convoys were overnight convoys from Danang to Chu Lai in support of 9th Engineer Battalion. One (1) mining incident occurred during March involving an M35A2C in direct support of the 7th Marine Regiment. The vehicle was subsequently assigned condition code.H.

Forty-four (44) Motor Transport items were evacutated to 1st FSR for repair, twenty-five (25) items were repaired and returned to service while five (5) were assigned a condition code H. Also during the reporting period, two (2) trucks, M35A2C and one (1) lube and service unit, 15 CFM were exchanged for like items through the Replacement and Evacuation program, FY-70.

Four (4) MedCaps were conducted in Khanh-Son hamlet (At 951760) with a total of ninety (90) people being treated. The battalion delivered two (2) truck loads of lumber to the Khanh-Son hamlet chief for distribution.

The men of 1st Motor Transport Battalion contributed five-hundred dollars (\$500) in January to defray the expenses of six (6) Vietnamese children traveling to the United States for open heart surgery. In February, the battalion contributed another one-hundred eighty dollars (\$180) for the orphans. On 28 March, three (3) of the orphans, returning from the United States, were welcomed home at the airport by members of 1st Motor Transport Battalion.
