PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 1 April 1971, Headquarters and Service Company and B Company, 1st Motor Transport Battalion, with a total of forty-eight (48) vehicles and twenty-six (26) personnel, departed Da Nang, RVN. The vehicles and twenty-one (21) personnel were embarked on the USS Duluth LPD 6 sailing on 1 April 1971 with an expected CONUS ETA of 17 April 1971. Five (5) personnel including the Battalion Commander departed by means of government air on 1 April 1971, reporting in to the Commanding General, 5th Marine Amphibious Brigade on 3 April 1971.

A Company, 1st Motor Transport Battalion remained in RVN, located at FLC. The company was ADCON to Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division and OPCON to 1st Marine Division. A Company possessed a total of eighty-one (81) vehicles and ninety-seven (97) personnel.
