NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. (S) During the month of July, 1st Radio Battalion, through its operational platoons deployed throughout Central and Southern I Corps Tactical Zone, provided on-the-spot direct support to tactical commanders of the 1st Marine Division and to Marine Aircraft Group 13, while the Battalion as a whole provided both direct and general support to the headquarters of III Marine Amphibious Force, the U.S. Army XXIV Corps, the 1st Marine Division, and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing. The direct support role was highlighted by the timely provision of vital tactical intelligence information to tactical commanders in the field. This direct support aided in the launching of successful assault missions, fire missions, blocking missions, air attacks and air strikes, search and destroy missions, and warnings of impending enemy attacks upon U.S. Marine and other Free World Forces installations and deployed units. The results of this direct support by 1st Radio Battalion elements ensured the continued loss by the enemy of personnel and equipment, the denial of freedom of movement to and from his forward base areas, and helped prevent the enemy from obtaining local provisions, supplies, and recruits.

On 16 July, 1st Radio Battalion operations were further expanded by the deployment of a Direct Support Unit with sites at FSB DEFIANT, FSB MACE, and, subsequently, HILL 110 to provide timely direct support to 7th Marine Regiment field commanders during Operation PICKENS FOREST.

- 2. (C) During the month of July, 1st Radio Battalion TRANSEC elements monitored 689 hours of III Marine Amphibious Force communications activity; a decrease of 128 hours from the figure for June. Total transmissions monitored numbered 57,005; a decrease of 8,216 from the figure for June. These decreases are attributed to the reduction of the number of TRANSEC monitoring positions from 6 in June to 3 in late July. Total TRANSEC violations numbered 56, of which 30 were spot reported to the command responsible for the violation; a significant reduction in the ratio of spot report to transmission over the previous month, reflecting an increasing awareness on the part of III Marine Amphibious Force communications personnel of the importance of TRANSEC principles.
- 3. (S) During the month of July, 1st Radio Battalion continued to provide tactical commanders with locations of enemy headquarters and units through ARDF and SRDF fixes. There were 2hl Fire Missions for a total of 8,190 rounds fired on ARDF and SRDF fixes during the month.


SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1. (C) There was one major operation conducted by Marine Forces in the I Corps Tactical Zone during the month of July, Operation PICKENS FOREST. A 1st Radio Battalion Direct Support Unit was deployed with the Regimental and Battalion headquarters thereby providing the field commanders with timely on-the-spot direct support. Operational platoons of 1st Radio Battalion continued their direct support of tactical commanders in Central and Southern I Corps Tactical Zone while providing general support to III Marine Amphibious Force and the U.S. Army XXIV Corps.




