

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. (S) During the month of September, 1st Radio Battalion, through its operational plateens deployed throughout Central Military Region I, provided on-the-spot direct support to tactical commanders of the 1st Marine Division, while the Battalion as a whole provided both direct and general support to the headquarters of III Marine Amphibious Force, the U. S. Army XXIV Corps, the 1st Marine Division, and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing. The direct support role was highlighted by the timely provision of vital tactical intelligence information to tactical commanders in the field. This direct support aided in the launching of successful assault missions, fire missions, blocking missions, air attacks and air strikes, search and destroy missions, and warnings of impending enemy attacks upon U.S. Marine and other Free World Forces installations and deployed units. The results of this direct support by 1st Radio Battalion elements ensured the continued loss by the enemy of personnel and equipment, the denial of freedom of movement to and from his forward base areas, and helped prevent the enemy from obtaining local provisions. supplies, and recruits.
- 2. (U) With the impending departure of 5th Communication Battalion (-) REIN USMC from Camp Hoa Long, DaNang, RVN, officially scheduled for 1 October 1970, the following was accomplished during the month of September 1970. Living quarters for Staff NCO's were consolidated within the staff area. The new sergeants quarters were occupied by this battalion. One Corpsman was assigned to this battalion (HM2 SANDS) and relocated the sick bay to bldg. #3456 (formerly the library). SgtMaj John L. Bates reported for duty 30 September 1970. Tower security was provided by U.S. Army troops; all other tasks were assumed by 1st Radio Battalion (-). Defensive plans were implemented and ordered to be executed in the event of an enemy ground attack upon the Camp Hoa Long Compound.
