
## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. (S) During the month of October, 1st Radio Battalian, through its operational platoons deployed throughout Quang Nam Province, provided onthe-spot direct support to tactical commanders of the 1st Marine Division, while the Battalian as a whole provided both direct and general support to the headquarters of III Marine Amphibious Force, the U.S. Army IXIV Corps, the 1st Marine Division, and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing. The direct support role was highlighted by the timely provision of vital tactical intelligence information to tactical commanders in the field. This support aided in the launching of successful assault missions, fire missions, blocking missions, air attacks, search and destroy missions, and warning of impending attacks upon U.S.Marines and Free World Force's installations and deployed units. The results of this direct support by 1st Radio Battalian elements ensured the continued loss by the enemy of personnel and equipment, the denial of freedom of movement to and from his forward base areas; and helped prevent the enemy from obtaining local provisions, supplies, and recruits.
- 2. (U) On 19 October 1970, the Commanding General, III MAF directed the Head-quarters of 1st Radio Battalion, located at Camp Hoa Long, and certain operational elements of 1st Radio Battalion, located at Camp Horn, to relocate jointly within the cantonment formerly occupied by Force Logistics Support Group- B at Camp Books. Echelonment of the Headquarters elements began on 21 October and was completed by 25 October, at which time the cantonment guard was completely assumed by the Battalion. Simultaneously with the move of the Headquarters elements, work commenced on the operations building in preparation for the operational move. The displacement of elements from Camp Horn is scheduled to be completed on 6 November 1970.

# SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 1. (C) There were two major operations conducted by Free World Forces in Quang Nam Province during the month of October; operation IMPERIAL LAKE, by elements of the Fifth Marines, and Operation TULLARE FALLS, by units of the U.S. Army. Operations IMPERIAL LAKE and TULLARE FALLS received direct real-time support from Operational Platoons of 1st Radio Battalion. Throughout Quang Nam Province, III Marine Amphibious Force and U.S. Army XXIV Corps continued to be provided general support by Operational Platoons of First Radio Battalion.
- 2. (C) Physical location of 1st Radio Battalion Platoons and Detachments.

## Date Events

- 1 Oct First Radio Battalion assumed interim responsibility for the operation of Camp Hoa Long until the arrival of sufficient U.S. Army personnel to operate the camp. An Industrial Relations Office was formed, and 20 Local National Civilian workers were hired to maintain essential health and hygiene services. A Battalion Aid Station was activated with one corpsman attached from III MAF. Gate security was provided by First Radio Battalion.
- 3 Oct LtCol D. L. MITCHELL, Marine Officer Assistant, DIRNAVSECGRUPAC, visited this Command in connection with orientation and liaison matters.
- 6 Oct Submitted LOGSUM 9-70. A civilian Technical Representative from FLC instructed Engineer Maintenance section on 700 series generator maintenance procedures.
- 7 Oct Generator records were sent to Sub Unit Two, 1st Radio Battalion this date.
- 9 Oct First Radio Battalion Site, located at Hill 425, changed Operational Control from the Third Platoon to the Fourth Platoon.
- 15 Oct Storm condition two set at approximately 2200H for tropical storm JOAN. Due to expected high wind and tides, personnel living at Camp Hoa Long began packing all personal gear and organizational equipment for evacuation to Freedom Hill.
- 16 Oct Due to change in tropical storm JOAN's course, the evacuation of Camp Hoa Long personnel and equipment was cancelled.
- 19 Oct Capt. G. E. SMITH and GySgt. L. B. HILL departed enroute to Siagon to attend DOD Special Representative Analyst Conference during the period 19-21 October 1970.
- 19 Oct The Commanding General, III MAF directed the Headquarters elements and certain operational elements of First Radio Battalion to relocate to Camp Books.
- 20 Oct LtGen McCUTCHEON visited this date and was briefed on First Radio Battalion Operations by LtCol RESNIK and Capt. MORGAN.

- 20 Oct Completed special, one-time back order validation program in accordance with CG III MAF 031015Z Oct 70.
- 21 Oct Commenced movement of First Radio Battalion elements from Camp Hoa Long to Camp Books. Supply began moving hand movable equipment.
- 22 Oct Move was progressing. Electronics Maintenance Section was moved fifty percent this date.
- 23 Oct S-1, H&S Company, and Electronics Maintenance Section completely moved.
- 24 Oct DaNang area entered storm condition I due to typhoon KATE.
- 25 Oct Relocation suspended until 1500H due to typhoon KATE. The following is a compilation of major damage to the 2nd Platoon attributed to typhoon KATE. All other Battalion Sites suffered either minor or no damage.
  - 4 Sea Huts Destroyed
  - 3 Sea Huts 25% to 30% damaged
  - 2 HF antenna legs downed
  - 3 RC-292 antennas damaged
  - 1 Generator shed destroyed
  - 1 Porch roof destroyed
  - 1 Water trailer shed destroyed
- 26 Oct Move recommenced. Two forklifts provided by 1st Engineer Battalion and two 5 ton trucks with low-bed semi-trailers from 11th Motor Transport Battalion were utilized in addition to organic transportation to finish move.
- 27 Oct Cleanup of Camp Hoa Long for turn-over to the Army carried out.
- 28 Oct Sent negative report on Search for Missing Government Property.
- 29 Oct Conducted inspection of Camp Hoa Long with Commanding Officer, Company "B", 84th Engineer Battalion, U.S. Army. Results were satisfactory.
- 31 Oct Tropical storm warning 12 due to tropical storm MARGE was received.

# 7. Equipment and Logistics (MARES)

- b. The drop in the percentage of combat readiness was directly attributable to the move from Camp Hoa Long which resulted in an increase of 10 deadlined vehicles.


