Patrols should move farther north off the ridgeline for closer observation toward the valley.





A. SYNOPSIS: This patrol covered a period of 8 hrs. with one sighting of 15 VC vicinity AT937372. The insertion helicopter received 75-100 rounds of small arms fire from AT932374 and AT936376; there were at least 30-40 VC in the area. Communication difficulties were encountered during the entire patrol as contact with Bad Actor was intermittent.

B. ENEMY:

1. Fifteen VC vicinity AT937372 moving 20 meters from the patrol's position; Black PJ's; unknown equipment.

2. Four VC moving NE coordinates AT933373; 1 khaki; 3 black PJ's and; coolie hats; 2 pole baskets; possible packs; VC in khakis into house vicinity above coordinates and 3 VC continued E down trail.

C. TERRAIN: Thick secondary underbrush of vines and small trees; nothing unusual.

D. OTHER INFORMATION: Upon insertion vicinity AT936374, helicopters received 75-100 rounds of small arms fire from estimated 15-20 VC located vicinity AT932374 and AT936376. Arty fire mission was called by patrol on these areas but canceled after two rounds because one round landed 50 meters from patrol.

At 211100H patrol began moving toward OP and up into high ground in attempt to gain communication with Bad Actor. Blackcoat Lima (A0) arrived on station to relay for patrol.

At 211230H, patrol heard and observed 15 VC 20 meters from their position at AT937372. Patrol suspected ambush was being sent and reversed their direction, moving back to their insertion HZ.

Air support arrived at 211400H and HU-E gunship (Deadlock 2-3) conducted four strafing runs and one rocket run at the request of the patrol leader onto areas of suspected VC location.

From 211515H-211620H patrol lost communication with Bad Actor. Deadlock 2-3 returned and conducted two more strafing runs. At 211745H, patrol was extracted.

6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: None

7. CONDITION OF PATROL: Good, Morale good.

8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: The entire area of this patrol's operation is infested with an unknown number of VC. Patrol leader estimated that the VC knew the patrol's location, and with communication difficulties, the mission was aborted.

For future patrols going into this area, a relay station must be instituted to insure constant communications. Patrols should be inserted higher up on the ridge instead of down in the valley.
