PART II - NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 3-4 Dec. A Technical Assistance Team from Fleet Marine Force, Pacific visited the FLSG.
- 7 Dec. MajGen. L. W. WALT, Commanding General, III Marine Amphibious Force visited the FLSG and talked with personnel from Maintenance Company.
- 8 Dec. LtGen. V. H. KRULAK, Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific visited the FLSG, was briefed by the Commanding Officer and toured portions of the FLSG area.
- 13 Dec. Completed relocation of a Bulk Fuel Farm from the Southeast to the Northwest end of the DaNang Air Base. This farm consisted of thirty-six (36) 10,000 gallon fuel bags. The relocation resulted in reducing pipeline requirements by two (2) miles and eliminating two (2) booster stations. Moved 1,000 55 gallon drums of packaged POL to new packaged POL Supply Point.
- 14 Dec. Conducted familiarization firing for the 50 caliber anti-aircraft machine gun crews. Fifty (50) men from FLSG participated in the familiarization firing.
- 22 Dec. BGen. L. E. ENGLISH visited the FLSG and was briefed by the Commanding Officer.
- 23 Dec. RAdm. J. W. KELLY, Chief of Chaplains, U. S. Navy visited the FLSG and dedicated the new FLSG Chapel. MGen. L. W. WALT, CG, III MAF attended the dedication.
- 24-25 Dec. Traditional Christmas religious services conducted and special menu was served at the FLSG and FLSU #1 and #2.
- 30 Dec. MajGen. L. J. FIELDS, Commanding General, 1st Marine Division FMF visited the FLSG and was briefed by the Commanding Officer.
- 31 Dec. The combined strength of the Force Logistic Support Group and Logistic Support Units increased by 42 enlisted personnel during the month, 3 Marine officers, 138 enlisted Marines and 2 Navy enlisted were joined. During the same period 3 Marine officers and 98 Marine enlisted were transferred.

A recap of other Force Logistic Support Group Functions follows:

- a. Data Processing key punched 66,100 cards, transceived 70,376 cards and processed 8,777,700 transactions during the regular updating runs.
- b. Clothing in the amount of \$98,063 was provided on an in-kind issue basis to Marines; Navy in-kind issue amounted to \$8,107, Cash Sales totaled \$9,160 and other miscellaneous transactions amounted to \$1,157.
- c. EOD destroyed 11,254 assorted rounds and recovered 1,187 rounds.
- d. Shipping and Receiving processed 3,688 short tons, 360,900 cubic feet of outgoing materiel and 2,014 short tons, 225,271 cubic feet of incoming materiel, (This does not include materiel belonging to tactical organizations).
- e. A total of 6,469 maintenance work orders were received and 6,250 work orders were completed during the period. A break-down of work orders by technical category follows:
