2. Summary of Events:

a. Transient Center: On 18 June 1966 a conference was held with representatives from FLC, Camp Butler, and Special Service (R&R) represented. The following recommendations were made and subsequently approved.

- (1) Immediate erection of 20 new tin roof structures.
- (2) Procure and install speaker system and floodlights
- (3) Additional telephone lines to be installed.

(4) Assignment of one M37 truck and trailer and an M422 to Transient facility for administrative details connected with daily functions.

(5) Replace 20KW generator now in use with 30 KW needed to handle additional lighting.

(6) Modernize existing structures (replace tentage with tin roofs) as other work load permits.

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(7) Construct a strongback/Tin roof structure to provide working space for the following.

- Camp Butler Liaison Section
- 3rd Division Administrative Section
- First Division Administrative Section
- Wing Administrative Section
- FLC Administrative Section
- NSA Liaison Section (if required)

(8) A large shelter to be constructed with a concrete deck 100' X 40' covered by a roof to provide shelter from sun and rain for the transients being processed.

(9) Control of all activity within this facility, including assignment of spaces to be vested in FLC. This includes housekeeping functions for which they now have responsibility and will include coordination between Camp Butler and III MAF agencies operating with the facility.

(10) It was agreed that present R&R procedures are valid and need no changes.

(11) Soda and small PX exists in Mobile Canteen making twice daily runs to Transient Facility and this was deemed adequate.

(12) Construction of new facilities was begun on 27 June.

(13) The average daily input for the month was 308 as compared with last month, which was 239.

b. Civic Action:

(1) With the pending move to Red Beach #2, it was determined that a Civic Action area be assigned by MAF to FLC close to new area. It was proposed that an area approximately 8000 meters long and 1500 meters wide, at its widest point, be assigned to FLC as the Civic Action coordination area. The area was tentatively approved by III MAF. Concurrence by Commanding General, 3rd Marine Division will be obtained and the exact area determined during early July.

c. Savings Bond Drive:

(1) During the month a drive to encourage participation in the allotment purchase of U.S. Savings Bonds was held. At the outset, 22% of the command participated. By 30 June this percentage had risen to 36.5%. The drive will continue until 75% participation is achieved.

(2) Maintenance Company, FLSG Alpha achieved the highest percentage within the command, with 82% participation.

d. Fiscal Conference 17-18 June:

(1) The following items were covered during a WestPac Fiscal Conference on 17-18 June 1966:

(a) A draft copy of Section Iv, FMFPACO 7000.2A (SOP for Financial Management) was reviewed in detail. The revised draft was returned to CG, FMFPac for approval and inclusion in the SOP.

(b) FY66 unobligated balances were reviewed and adjustments made to the authorizations where necessary.

(c) The 1st Qtr, FY67 Financial Plan was up-dated and fund allocations were made accordingly.

(d) FY67 accounting and reporting procedures were reviewed and minor changes made where appropriate.

(e) FLC presented reimbursable procedures which would go into effect on 1 July 1966. See TAB B.

(f) Plant property accounting to be accomplished by FLC was discussed. Plant property will be accounted for in the same manner as garrison property.

e. Commanders Conference:

(1) On 25 June, the third Force Logistic Command Conference was held at the FLSG Alpha Staff NCO Club.

(2) The Commanding Officers, Force Logistic Command, FLSG Alpha, FLSG Bravo; key staff officers, and certain subordinate commanders were present. The Commanding Officer, FLSG Alpha acted as official host.

(3) Each agenda item was introduced by a staff officer who gave a short summary of status, problems, plans, and recommendations. The item was then offered for general discussion with the purpose of arriving at a recommended course of action. The following agenda items were discussed:

3. Chronology of Events:

- 7 June 1966 --BGen CONROY, Commander, Western Area, Military Traffic Management and Terminal Service, Oakland, California was briefed on Force Logistic Command mission.
- 12 June 1966--BGen RYAN, Commanding General, 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade, was briefed on Force Logistic Command mission and organization and given tour of Force Logistic Support Group Alpha area.
- 13 June 1966--A request submitted to the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific to activate the Company Headquarters, Force Logistic Command, that a separate Reporting Unit Code be assigned and authority be granted to establish an organic property account.

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- 15 June 1966--The ACofS, G-4 (LtCol R. M. COOK, USMC) was medically evacuated to USNH, Yokosuka. Return to duty with this Command not probable.
- Major C. R. CHANEY USMC, Assistant G-4, designated ACofS, G-4 vice LtCol R. M. COOK, USMC.
- 17 June 1966--WestPac Fiscal Conference was held at 3d FSR for a period of two days.
- 18 June 1966--A conference was held with representatives from FLC, Camp Butler, and the III MAF R&R representative regarding the Transient Center.
- 20 June 1966--FLC was authorized to requisition specific items contained in the Provisional T/E.
- 21 June 1966--FMFPac Personnel Conference was held at Headquarters, CG FMFPac/IMAC (FWD) for a period of 3 days.
- 22 June 1966--Major C. R. CHANEY, USMC ACofS, G-4 injured in jeep accident and air evacuated to USNH, Yokosuka. With his evacuation the G-4 Section was reduced to zero officer strength.
- 24 June 1966--Major G. C. HAZARD, USMC reported for duty from CONUS and assigned duty as ACofS, G-4.
- 27 June 1966--Construction of new facilities for the Transient Center was begun.
- 30 June 1966--FLSG ALPHA began movement to Red Beach #2 with approximately 120 men for security and preparation of facilities.

1. Purpose: To promulgate instructions concerning reimbursable Supply and Maintenance Support to other than Marine Corps units, to include Marine Air Wing units (citing Navy appropriation).

2. Background:

Other Services, to include Marine Air Wing units supporting Navy Owned equipment, and RMK Construction Company, desiring Supply and maintenance support from the FLC must be prepared to obtain subject support on a reimbursable basis. The basic documents required in obtaining this support will be the DD Form 1150 (request for issue or turn-in), DD Form 1348 (MILSTRIP), and the Tactical Equipment Repair Order (TERO).

3. Discussion:

Reimbursable support rendered by FLC units will be divided into three classifications i.e., Class III (Bulk POL: Packaged POL), Class II and IV support, and maintenance support.

4. Action:

a. Class III bulk products will be issued only when a properly prepared six part DD Form 1150 is presented to the issuing activity citing the requesting units full appropriation data or a minimum of data as shown in enclosure (1).
