PART II

Narrative Summary

1. Effective 1 December 1966, Force Logistic Support Unit #2 was designated a major sub command of the Force Logistic Command by FLCO 5401.2. Force Legistic Support Unit #1 and the Logistic Support Unit Khe Sanh were designated as subordinate command of Force Logistic Support Unit #2. All units were previously sub units of Force Logistic Support Group ALPHA. With the assumption of Operational and Administrative Control of Force Logistic Support Unit #1 and Logistic Support Unit Khe Sanh; Force Logistic Support Unit #2 became responsible for all logistic support from the Phu Bai TAOR north to the Demilitarized Zone. Initially, much of the supply support continues to be received from Force Logistic Support Group ALPHA at DaNang, until such time as adequate stockage levels are reached at the Phu Bai Base. During this period, Logistic Support Unit Khe Sanh assumed logistic support of a battalion size unit in the Khe Sanh area from 3d Marine Division Shore Party (LSA). Force Logistic Support Support Unit #1 continued logistic support of a large portion of the 3d Marine Division (Forward) in the Dong Ha area while Force Logistic Support Unit #2 at Phu Bai provided support to 3d Marine Division (-). During this period of reorganization, all reports, supply and maintenance requests from Force Logistic Support whit #1 and Logistic Support Unit Khe Sanh have been received and processed thru Force Logistic Support Unit #2 for coordination of all logistic support. On 21 December 1966, movement of Class V from the old ammunition dump to the new ammunition dump commenced.
