PART II - NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Remarks and Comments.

a. Personnel. There were 377 personnel joined during the month, 257 personnel were transferred.

b. Administration. Operational control of Detachment Company "A", Third Medical Battalion at Force Logistic Support Unit #2 was returned to Third Marine Division effective 4 April 1966.

c. Special Operations.

5 April 1966. BrigGen VANSTOCKUM, CG, IMAC (forward) visited this Command.

On 4th, 10th, 14th, 17th, 23rd and 28th of April 1966. "Rough Rider" convoys proceeded to FLSU #2, Phu Bai, to furnish resupply and support to operations in that area.

20 April 1966. A Fuel Storage back-up facility was established (ready for operation) at COL CO Beach near HUE. This facility has a capacity of 110,000 gallons Avgas and 80,000 gallons JP-4.

1-30 April 1966. Civil disturbances in the DANANG and HUE areas interrupted normal routine. Alternate methods of resupply were employed to maintain operation.

1-30 April 1966. Continued to render support to Operations "ORANGE", "VIRGINIA" and "GEORGIA"
