b. Administration.

The Commanding Officers of H&S Co., Supply Co., Maintenance Co., and FLSU #2 were granted Special Court Martial authority by FMFPac.

c. Special Operations.

(1) 5 May 1966. Lt Gen KRULAK, CG, FMFPac visited this Command.

(2) 1-31 May 1966. Civil disturbances in the DaNang and Hue areas interrupted normal routine. Alternate methods of resupply were employed to maintain operation.

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d. Logistics.

(1) 10 May 1966. Direct supply support of Operation "GEORGIA" was discontinued when the operation was terminated. Direct resupply by air to 3d Bn, 9th Marines at AN HOA continues.

(2) 25 May 1966. Additional Fuel Bags were installed and placed in operation at COL CO Beach HUE, increasing the fuel capacity for MOGAS to 50M gallons and 60M gallons for DIESEL.

(3) On the 3d, 9th and 31st of May 1966. "Rough Rider" convoys proceeded to FLSU #2, Phu Bai, to furnish resupply and support to operations in that area.

(4) A 15-ton ice plant was activated and commenced issuing during the reporting period.

e. Civil affairs/community relations.

(1) Thirty-three (33) Vietnamese are presently undergoing vocational training within FLSG-A as follows:

- 7 Warehousemen
- 1 Shipping and Receiving Clerk
- 6 Carpenter helpers
- 2 Key Punch Operators
- 8 Mechanics helpers
- 4 Tire repairmen
- 1 Glass cutter
- 1 Painters helper
- 3 File clerks

Plans are being formulated to expand this program to increase the number of skills and personnel.

(2) Fifteen loads of scrap lumber were collected and distributed to elements of the 3d Division in support of Civil Affairs programs.

(3) 720 pounds of bread were donated to the Sacred Heart Orphanage in DaNang and 240 pounds to the WEC Orphanage. These orphanages support 500 and 75 orphans respectively. In addition, Maintenance Company has donated a total of \$400.00, as well as 200 dolls and assorted candies, to these orphanages.
