

PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of August, the Force Logistic Command established an additional Logistical Support Unit under FISG-A at LZ BALDY. The LZ BALDY LSU will support the 7th Marine Regiment in their new TAOR. Full support of classes I, through IX is provided, plus a limited third echelon maintenance capability and laundry facilities.

The redeployment of RIT-9 was accomplished by 25 August. Force Logistic Command filled MO/MOA material requirements from excesses, based on a 10% reduction of the requisitioning objective. Approximately 50% of the Prepositioned War Reserve requirements for RIT-9 were completed for classes II, IV, VII, and IX. Full provisions were made for classes I, III and V. FLC computed, pulled, packed, marked for shipment, and delivered material to FOE's for redeploying units. Washdown facilities, plus supply and maintenance provisions were also arranged for redeploying units. PP&P and Chocking and Dunnage were provided on a requisition basis.

Maintenance production for the month totaled 9,446 TERO's and an additional 1,970 items were washed out. 11,720 TERO's were opened during the month. FLC added a new maintenance capability during August with the receipt of new items of calibration and test equipment which enabled the calibration of infra-red instruments. 33 fire suppression kit modifications were performed on the LVTP5Al this month along with 77 EIMCO tractor modifications required completed in the Dong Ha, Quang Tri and Chu Lai areas.

The volume of transactions processed by the Central Control Point remained high with a fill rate of 64%. About 9,000 transactions were for the transfer of excesses to the 3rd Force Service Regiment on Okinawa.






c. Civil Affairs

- (1) 1 August 1969 Members of the FLC G-5 section attended the formal opening of the new school year at the Bo De Thanh Phong primary school.
- (2) 7 August 1969 The brick factory located at 7th Engineer Battalion has been temporarily closed. The reason is that the demand for bricks is not as great as it once was and there now exists a large supply of bricks on hand. Emphasis will now be placed on the villagers making the bricks they need right in the hamlet.
- (3) 15 August 1969 Maintenance Battalion, 1stFSR has come under the control of FLC G-5 for civil affairs functions. Up to this time they had been under the control of 1st Marine Division for civil affairs matters.
- (4) 20 August 1969 Regular English classes are being conducted at Chon Tam High School by members of Communication Company, lstFSR/FLC.
- (5) 28 August 1969 In the hamlet of Nam 0 over 400 meters of flood control culvert has been laid.
- (6) 28 August 1969 The elementary school at Da Son was completely remodeled by the villagers.
- (7) 29 August 1969 A checkpoint, built for the 1st Ranger Group Hoa My sector, at Nam O has been completed.
- (8) 31 August 1969 A total of 49,780\$VN from Civic Action Funds was expended during the month of August.
- (9) 29 August 1969 The Quarterly Personal Response School started today. A total of 33 Marines and 1 Navy (Dental Officer) of units within Force Logistic Command attended the two day school. Subjects presented were Introduction to Personal Response, movie "The Unique War", Action-Reaction, a discussion period, The Vietnamese Military, IRO at FLC, Vietnamese Religion and History, and the CAP Program. All subjects discussed were to help the individual Marine to more fully understand the Vietnamese people by acquainting the Marines with Vietnamese religion, culture and way of life.
- (10) 30 August 1969 The second day of the Quarterly Personal Response School included a review of the first day and a critique, then a tour of An Ngai Tay Hamlet where the Marines saw first hand the way of life for a Vietnamese peasant. They went to the Market place, a Catholic School, a Blacksmith Shop and the Village Chief's House where American pigs









and rabbits are being bred and raised. The tour then went to Hoa Khanh Childrens Hospital where they toured the different parts of the hospital and finally walked through the ward and saw the effects of war on children. The tour then proceeded to the City of Da Nang where they toured a Cao Dai temple and a Buddist Temple, the two largest religions in Viet Nam.



In addition, technical training was arranged in areas not provided for by formal recurring instruction utilizing internal resources. The Command Nuclear Biological and Chemical Officer conducted three staff visits to subordinate units and rendered technical assistance and guidance as requested at that time. One Noncommissioned Officer Leadership Course was conducted and four specialized lectures were presented on Foreign Military Weapons to FLC personnel.

(2) Significant Events and Activities

- (a) One course of instruction was conducted by the Command NCO Leadership School.
- (b) NCO School students and staff participated in one combat night ambush within the FLC/TAOR. There were no significant results and/or casualties reported.



I. GENERAL:


The Commanding General, Force Logistic Command was tasked by Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force; Pacific to reconstitute mount-out and mount-out augmentation requirements for Marine Corps units redeploying from RVN to Japan and Okinawa. Mount-out and mount-out augmentation requirements for Classes II, IV, VII and IX were furnished to Force Logistic Command by Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific on magnetic tape in AOI requisition format. Class I, II and V day levels were prescribed by the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific; however, specific requirements were submitted to the Force Logistic Command by the units concerned.

II. CURRENT STATUS/FORECAST:

A. The reconstitution of mount-out, Classes II, III, IV, VII, and IX as specified for redeploying Marine Corps units was completed on 10 July. Class I mount-out and mount-out augmentation for all classes of supplies as specified by Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific will be reconstituted prior to 30 July. No difficulties are foreseen in this area. All mount-out and mount-out augmentation material is scheduled for delivery to the second increment of RIT-9 for shipment to the Provisional Service Battalion, 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade on Okinawa.

B. The main problem encountered has been the inaccuracies in the equipment density file utilized for repair parts computations. It is the understanding of this headquarters that the equipment density file was provided by the Marine Corps Supply Activity, Philadelphia. This headquarters has notified Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific concerning these inaccuracies. As a result of the use of this file, numerous excesses were computed and provided, and also deficiencies exist as a result of numerous items of equipment not being included in the equipment density file.

Subject: Statistical performance for classes II, IV, VII, VIII and IX during Fiscal Year 1969.

I. GENERAL:

Force Logistic Command provides supply support to all III MAF units for classes II, IV, VII, VIII and IX. Statistical performance for Fiscal Year 1969 is indicated in paragraph II A below.

I. CURRENT STATUS/FORECAST:

A. The following statistics portray the responsiveness of Force Logistic Command for Fiscal Year 1969.

- (1) Demands. A total of 676,374 requisitions, or an average of high of 68,137 during May to low of 47,033 during July.
- (2) Demands Against Items with a Computed Requisitioning Objective (RO). Of the 676,374 demands, 585,014 or 86.5% were for items with a computed requisitioning objective (normally stocked items).
- (3) Requisition Priority Utilization. Priority utilization averages were as follows:

- (4) Fill Rate. The average complete fill rate for all items was 51.5% with a high of 58% for June and a low of 47 during september. The a high of 61% during June and a low of 48% during September. In addition, the re was an average partial fill of 6%.
- (5) Issues. A total of 732,485 materiel release orders, or an average of 61,040 per month we processed in support of III MAF units. This rigure includes unitial issues and backorder releases, bo a complete and partial.
- a high of 28 in July and a low of 5% in May.

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(7) Requisition Processing and Shipment Preparation Times.
Averages by priority (expresed in days) are as follows:

- (8) <u>Backorders</u>. An average of 82,591 backorders for III MAF units were held at the end of each month with a high of 98,941 in September and a low of 70,564 in June.
- (9) Federal Stock Numbers (FSN's) on Backorder. An average of 16,059 FSN's were responsible for backorders at the end of each month with a high of 23,692 in August and a low of 11,744 in May.
- (10) Supply Updates. A total of 180 supply updates or an average of 15 per month were processed during the period.
- $\ensuremath{\mathrm{B}}_{\bullet}$ Progress or improvement has been experienced in the following areas.
- (1) Requisition Priority Utilization. Priority 02 requisitions have declined steadily from a high of 28.9% in September to an all time low of 15.4% in June. The average for priority 02 requisitions was reduced from 27.3% during the first quarter of the Riscal Year to 16.1% during the last quarter. The yearly low of 15.4% compares favorable with the Marine Corps goal of 15%. The dramatic reduction of priority 02 requisitions was accompanied by a gradual increase in priority 17 requisitions. These two related trends are viewed as favorable indicators of improving supply support.
- (2) Fill Rate. The complete fill rate rose to an average of 54.7% during the last quarter of the Fiscal Year. The 58% attained during June was the high point for the year.
- (3) Stock Denials. The stock denial rate declined from an average of 25.7% during the first quarter to 6% for the last quarter of the Fiscal Year. The 5% attained during May was the lowest in the history of ILC.
- (4) Requisition Processing and Shipment Preparation Times. Requisition processing time was reduced from 11.23 days during the first quarter to 9.16 days during the last quarter and shipment preparation time was reduced from 12.51 days to 7.95 days during the same period, for a collective reduction of 6.63 days. The total requisition processing and shipment preparation time of 17.11 days is the lowest recorded.
- (5) Backorders. Backorders were reduced from 98,941 in September to 70,564 at the end of June. The 70,564 backorders recorded at the end of the Fiscal Year is the lowest total since January 1968.

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- (6) Federal Stock Numbers (FSN's) on Backorder. The actual number of items on backorder has been reduced from an average of 21,551 during the first quarter to 12,689 during the last quarter. This significant decrease reduces the range of the inventory management problem and permits increased emphasis on the lesser number of items.
- C. The following management improvement programs which are responsible for the improvements experienced to date will be continued:
- (1) Quarterly location verification, zero balance inventory and night dollar value inventory.
- (2) Monthly file maintenance to include matching of related inventory management fields and processing the monthly change tape from the IGP.
 - (3) Quarterly 100% reconciliation with all sources of supply.
 - (4) Quarterly review and cancellation of excess dues
 - (5) Identification and reporting of excesses.
- U. darring unforseen circumstances, the programs enumerated above should provide comparable or slightly improved performance statistics.


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- A. With the approval of Headquarters Marine Corps and Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific this Command has been conducting an extensive program to identify excesses in RVN. This program was triggered by a briefing provided to Government Accounting Office personnel during September 1968 which, among other things, indicated the existence of a 69 million dollar excess in the Fleet Stock Account.
- B. Commanding General, Force Logistic Command message 200124Z Oct 68 reported to Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific that the reported excesses were obtained from a highly suspect data base and outlined the programs in effect to purify the records.
- C. On 11 January 1969 the Commandant of the Marine Corps was provided with a briefing which covered the then current status of the mubile of program. This fact sheet will uplate the briefing.

Subj: New Maintenance Battalion Area

Date: 7 July 1969

I. General: Initial work began on this new area in August 1968 with Naval construction forces assigned to all vertical structures and the U.S. Contractor to the horizontal work. The first area completed was the road net and buildings for Motor Transport Maintenance Company. Work was halted in mid-September 1968 during the monsoon season and resumed again in November 1968.

II. Current Status:

To date all roads and hardstands are completed. All buildings shown as shaded areas on Supplemental Data Sheet A are completed. The remaining buildings are now under construction and completion is expected prior to the end of August 1969.

Steady progress has not been achieved on this project due to reassignment of the Naval Construction Forces to major disaster recovery operations and other higher priority type work. As a result the expected completion dates have slipped necessitating partial occupancy of the area by companies of Maintenance Battalion. All Maintenance Companies now occupy the new facilities with the exception of Electronics Maintenance Company.

At this point, it seems certain that the entire project will be completed this month with the exception of some ancillary equipment for the buildings which has not yet been received by the Naval construction forces. The monetary value of this entire area is slightly in excess of 3.1 million dollars and will provide the facilities required by this Command to properly perform maintenance support services for the III Marine Amphibious Force.


