###### b. Legal

(1) Legal Assistance. Legal assistance was rendered in 98 cases during the month of January 1969.

(2) Legal Lectures and Inspections. One legal lecture on search and seizure was given during January 1969. One legal inspection (1st Military Police Battalion) was held during January 1969.



(3) Disciplinary Court-Martial Cases. A total of 71 courts-martial were tried within FLC during the month of January 1969.

c. Purchasing and Contracting. The Purchasing and Contracting Office, 1st Force Service Regiment/Force Logistic Command purchased various items in Vietnam on the open market for the support of military forces in Vietnam during the month. A total of \$270,049.16 was obligated during the month.

d. Logistic

(1) Overall Supply Situation. No specific problems in the overall supply situation were encountered during the month of January.

(2) Status

a. No. of line items stocked	122,270
b. No. of demands for stocked items	49,101
c. No. of demands for non-stocked items	6,915
d. No. of demands for stocked items filled	25,533

(3) Class III(A) and III (W)

a. Situation. During the month of January the overall posture remained good. The problem area stated in the September Logistic Summary, concerning surface resupply to An Hoa due to the ferry being inoperable on occasion, has been resolved by the installation of a hose line crossing the river near the bridge site. One line for JP-4 became operational on 15 January, and another for diesel fuel became operational on 27 January. The ISA at An Hoa increased its JP-4 capacity to 80,000 gallons with the installation of four 1,000 gallon tanks at the new landing site. One JP-4 tank was removed from the old site due to lack of space.

b. Significant Problem Areas. There were no significant problems encountered during the month of January.

(4) Class V(A) and V(W)

a. Situation. Ammunition assets were distributed to meet commitments. During the month of January, MAERU changed component parts on 20,714 rounds of 81mm ammunition, and broke down and evaluated 1,166 rounds of 81mm ammunition. Ammunition Company, Supply Battalion at ASP #1 and ASP #2 handled a total of 43,584 short tons of munitions for a daily average of 1,405 short tons. The total expenditure for the month of January was \$31,005,453.31.

b. Significant Problem Areas. None.

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e. Maintenance Situation

(1) The percent of III MAF combat essential equipment deadlined for field maintenance in Force Logistic Command shops on 23 January 1969 was as follows:

a. Communication/Electronics. Procedures and capabilities have been developed for performance of field maintenance on the An/PRC-88 radio now being placed in service.

b. Engineer

(1) During the month, all PU-660 series generators in stock were modified. These are now ready for issue.

(2) Expedited supply action, through FMFPac and MCSA Philadelphia, was taken on all parts required for Eimco Tractor Modification. Modification instructions and specifications were prepared for submission to CMC.

(3) A conference was held with all major commands on 20 January and recommendations were developed for the FY-70 FMFPac Rebuild Program.

f. Motor Transport

(1) The deadline rate of 2½ ton multifuel trucks was reduced because of receipt of a sufficient quantity of clutch disks to repair the entire backlog of vehicles.

(2) The lack of a sufficient quantity of 5-ton multifuel engines continued to hamper the maintenance effort.

(3) The program for reconditioning 85 M-54 gasoline engine trucks for the Republic of Korea Marine Corps was completed.

g. Ordnance

(1) The M16A1 rifle retrofit program has been completed and final production line quantities are being distributed.

(2) Artillery deadline rate has declined in the past 30 days. Presently, 2.8% of the artillery assets are deadlined for field maintenance.

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h. Services Situation

(1) Boot Repair. Sixty-one pairs of boots were repaired in the past month.

(2) Graves Registration. A total of 387 human remains were processed during the month of January. Graves Registration personnel conducted three search and recovery missions in January.

(3) Laundry Processed. A total of 563,607 pounds of laundry were processed during the month of January.

(4) Bakery. Force Logistic Command bakeries produced a total of 819,321 pounds of bread during the month of January.

(5) Ice. Force Logistic Command organizations produced 707,600 pounds of ice and procured 4,442,140 pounds of ice during the month.

1. Significant Problem Areas. The 1st Military Police Battalion has a requirement for grass cutting service around the perimeter of Danang Air Base. The lack of this service decreases the effectiveness of perimeter security. One grass cutter is available from the Public Works Office; however, this cutter works full time cutting the areas around the runways.

j. Civil Affairs

(1) 19Jan69 - The Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital was dedicated this date. Guest speakers included Lieutenant General IAM, Major General YOUNGDALE, and Brigadier General FEELEY. The Province, District, Village and most Hamlet Chiefs from this area were present for the ceremony.

(2) 20Jan69 - The semi-annual inspection of 1st Military Police Battalion was conducted. The rating of the Civil Affairs inspection was satisfactory with minor discrepancies.

(3) 23Jan69 - The monthly III MAF PSYOPS Conference was held this date. The Pre TET PSYOPS Plan was discussed relative to themes and implementation.

(4) 24Jan69 - An I Corps Area Coordinators Conference was hosted at III MAF Headquarters. The 1969 Pacification Program was discussed.

k. Industrial Relation

(1) 21Jan69 - The Semi-Annual inspection of the 1st Military Police Battalion Industrial Relations Program was conducted with satisfactory results.

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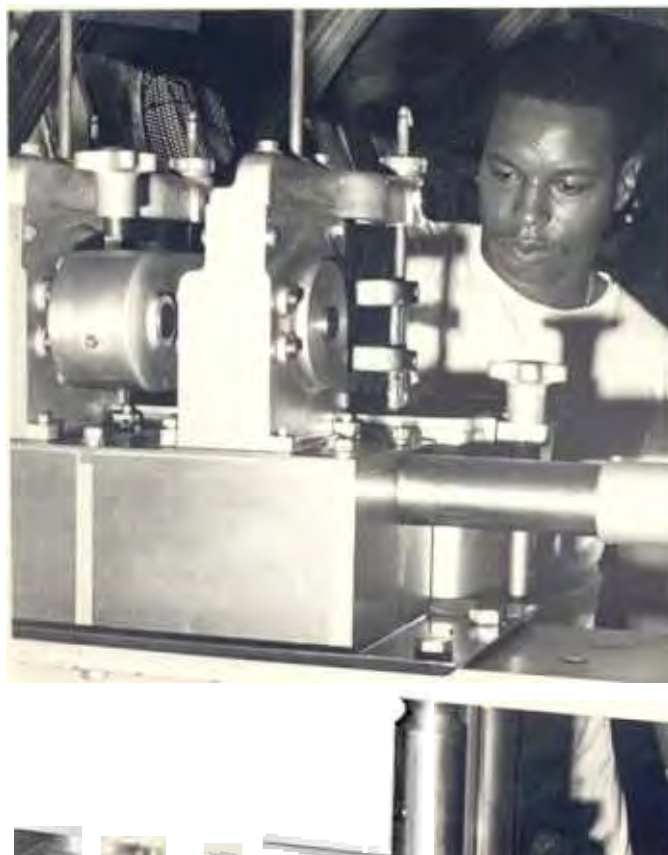
