## PART II

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

#### Supply Platoon:

During the month of January, the RSA went to full mechanization. Prior to January, Federal Groups 00 through 59 had been introduced into the computer at the central control point. Federal Groups 60 through 99 were introduced 14 January, completing full mechanization of all Class II supplies. The first receipt of supplies under the new designation of MC210 were received on 9 January 1969. The RSA is presently key punching all transactions submitted by using units. Due to the transceiver not being operative as of this time, all key punched transactions are being forwarded to the CCP by courier. Forklift support during the month of January reached 85%. The RSA has experienced a critical shortage of oxygen and acetylene gas. A liaison visit to the CCP was executed and personnel there were made aware of the existing problem. A solution is anticipated by achieving support from MRI.

#### Shipping and Receiving:

During the month of January 1969, Shipping and Receiving processed gear for four (4) convoys to FLC with a total of 470,925 lbs. of cargo. Received eight (8) convoys from FLC with a total of 1,148,768 lbs. of cargo received and processed. The use of convoys from Dong Ha, Quang Tri and Phu Bai has increased the capability of shipping cargo to FLC and returns. Cargo and equipment arrive in excellent condition. Convoys also relieve the back log at the different locations.

#### Shop Stores:

Shop Stores continued its support of repair parts to the individual maintenance repair shops within Maintenance Company, FLSC-Bravo. During January, the CIC of shop stores attended the Secondary Depot Repairable program meeting at the CCP.

## PART II

### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

#### Electronic Maintenance:

On 21 January 1969, liaison was established by Electronic Maintenance Platoon with the 578th Light Equipment Company, Phu Bai, in regard to maintenance support for the AN/PPS-5. An ISSA is in effect. Four AN/PPS-5's were escorted to Phu Bai on 31 January 1969.

#### Engineer Maintenance:

The completion of the new Butler type building for Engineers has increased the platoon effectiveness. There is much less work to be done outside, and inclement weather does not slow production.

#### Ordnance Maintenance:

The Ordnance Platoon has shipped one M-109 How(SP), three M48A3 tanks, and one M-67A2 flame tank to the Replacement and Evacuation Program.

#### Motor Transport Maintenance:

Motor Transport Maintenance Platoon has shipped 72 vehicles this month.  
15 for repair and return to 1st FSR.  
36 Excess vehicles to 1st FSR.  
21 Shipped to 3rd FSR, FMFPac rebuild program.  
384 items have been exchanged through the DX program.

#### Miscellaneous:

Truck convoys to Danang continue to speed the movement of Retrograde.
