2. Sequential Listing of Significant Events

a. Personnel: The organization experienced a growth of 124 Marine Corps personnel during the period. The allocation of funds for the hire of local national civilian employees has not been received at this time,, but it is anticipated that these funds will be available during the fourth quarter of Calendar Year 1966. No significant changes were experienced in the areas of morale, discipline or personnel services.

12-13 September: Command Orientation Program completed for 126 newly joined men.

14 September: Officers School conducted on Investigation Procedures, by the FLC Legal Section.

19-20 September: Command Orientation Program completed for 69 newly joined men.

21 September: 22 men completed their TAD assignments to combat duty with infantry units. 14 men served with the 7th Marines and 8 men served with the 5th Marines.

26 September: A contact team from MCSG, Barstow, conducted a school on the 60 KW generator for members of the Service Platoon.

26-27 September: Command Orientation Program completed for 69 newly joined men.

26-27 September: Officers and Staff NCO school conducted on Legal Aspects of Court Room Procedures by FLC Legal Section.

28 September: 23 men completed their TAD assignments to combat duty with the infantry units. 13 men served with the 7th Marines and 10 men served with the 5th Marines.

e. Special Operations

FLSG-Bravo established an ISA on KY HA during the period 050600H to 151200H in support of Operation NAPA. A copy of the Post Operation Report is attached. (See TAB-A)

FLSG-Bravo also established an ISA at QUANG NGAI during the period 081100H to 271230H in support of Operations FRESNO and GOLDEN FLEECE 7-1. Operation FRESNO terminated 162400H and Operation GOLDEN FLEECE 7-1 commenced immediately at 170001H. A copy of the Post Operation Report is attached. (See TAB-B)

(1) Radio Section. The radio section provided radio communications

to support 2 ISAs during operations NAPA, FRESNO and GOLDEN FLEECE 7-1. This section continues to guard the Chu Lai Defense Net during the hours of darkness, and maintains a 24 hour watch on FLSG-Bravo Command Net #2. With the approach of the rainy season, extra attention has been given to the storage of radio equipment, and to the centralization and protection of equipment while engaged in operations.

(2) Message Center Section: During the month, this sections processed a total of 6,049 messages. The FLC circuit continues to be unreliable, however, ample backup is provided by the NTA circuit of 1st MARDIV. Added emphasis has been placed on the centralization of supplies and protection against the weather with the approach of the rainy season.

(3) Wire Section: This section has provided wire for the two ISAs that were operational during the month. A switchboard and new lines were installed in Supply Company. Additionally, this section installed 4 ten pair cables, 1 six pair cable, and 5 new phones.

(4) Maintenance Section: The Teletype technicians maintained and performed second echelon maintenance and adjustments on teletype and associated equipment. The KY-8 technicians maintained and performed 2nd echelon maintenance on organic radio equipment and TH-5's. The retransmission capability of the AN/PRC-25 was also tested.

i. Logistics: Nothing significant.

j. Air Defense: Nothing significant.

k. Medical and Dental Support: Nothing significant.

l. Civil Affairs/Civic Action: During the month the Group Civic Action Team launched a program to distribute soap to the people of Chu Lai New Life Hamlet on a regular periodic basis. In the initial distribution, 3 bars of soap were given to each family, for a total of approximately 2500 bars.

General improvements were made at the dispensary and two stall showers were installed. A hand type pump is all that is needed to complete the unit. Over 2600 civilians were treated by the Civil Affairs Corpsmen. There are presently very few cases of Plague in the hamlet.

The new school has been completed and classes will begin as soon as the District Chief grants his approval. FLSG-Bravo donated a set of swings for the school playground.

Work was accomplished on the reconstruction of the pig farm, however, the replacement animals have not arrived from USAID.

FLSG-Bravo gave several thousand cookies, pieces of candy, apples, oranges and other treats to the children of the Chu Lai New Life Hamlet, in conjunction with the annual childrens' mid-autumn festival.

m. Chaplain Support: Chaplain P. W. PEARSON reported aboard to assume the duties of Chaplain for FLSG-Bravo. This organization continues to provide Chapel supplies for units within the combat base.

n. Significant Events:

6-7 September: Colonel TREADWELL and an inspection team from FMFPAC inspected FLSG-Bravo.

7 September: Colonel CUSS, 1stMAW Inspector made a liaison visit to FLSG-Bravo in conjunction with supply matters.

8 September: Lieutenant General V. H. KRULAK, Commanding General, FMFPAC visited FLSG-Bravo for a tour of facilities and a briefing.

25 September: Major General R. G. DAVIS, G-1, HQMC toured the facilities of FLSG-Bravo and received a briefing.

o. Status of Construction Program

(1) Ice Plant (15 ton capacity) exterior completed and 60% painted. Interior 80% completed, still awaiting parts.

(2) Permanent ASP: Revetment roads 1, 2, and 4 - 90% complete. Ammunition pads started on revetment roads 1 and 2. Initial ground preparation started in segregation area, and night work is in progress.

(3) Maintenance buildings 11A and 11B complete. Buildings 17A and 17B complete except for electrical hookups. Buildings 14, 15, and 20 are 45% complete. Building 13 is 40% complete.

(4) POL Dispensing Pad has the rough road preparation completed.

(5) Cantonment program has 20 new huts completed and 3 strong-backs converted to tin roofs.
