- 2 Feb. Bobby RYDELL show performed for members of the FLSG.
- 5 Feb. CG, FMFPac, LtGen. KRULAK visited FLSG and was briefed by Commanding Officer, Col. PADALINO. General KRULAK stated that improvement at FLSG since his last visit was "excellent."
- 12 Feb. FLSG conducted Administrative/Technical Inspection in preparation for Commanding General 3d Marine Division Inspection.
