NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1-31 December 1967, the Force Logistic Command continued to provide sustained logistic support to the III Marine Amphibious Force organizations and the Republic of Korea Marine Brigade.

2. Force Logistic Command and subordinate units provided support for the following operations: DRAGON TRAIL (ROKMC), DRAGON FIRE (ROKMC), OSCEOLA, LANCASTER, KENTUCKY, NAPOLEON, NEOSHO, SCOTLAND, AUBURN, PITTI, and CITRUS.

b. Legal

(1) Legal Assistance. Legal assistance was rendered in 71 cases during the month of December.

(2) Disciplinary Court Martial cases. A total of 30 courts-martial were tried within FLC during December, 26 of which were either summary or special courts martial trials, and 4 of which were general courts-martial.

(3) Legal Lectures. Eight lectures were given during the month of December 1967.

c. Data Processing

(1) On 23 December 1967 permanent electrical power services were provided to the Data Processing Platoon. These services were somewhat erratic initially but through the cooperative efforts of FLC G-4 and the SeaBees from MCB 74 along with technical advice and stabilizing efforts provided by NSA Public Works power is now stable and dependable.

(2) The parallel process conducted within the Personnel Accounting System provided a few apprehensive days due to work load increase and tight scheduling however system is settled down and appears to be operating on as smooth a basis as can be expected at this time. The transition to PAS as prime process rather than parallel will take place with Unit Diaries received on 1 January 1968. DPP #16 will then become the vehicle initiating mechanized processing into the PAS for all Marines and Navy personnel attached to Marine Corps Activities within the Republic of Vietnam.

(3) Ten updates were accomplished introducing some 695,290 transactions into the MILSTRIP/MILSTRAP process.

d. Purchasing and Contracting

(1) Purchased various items in Vietnam on the open market for support of military forces in Vietnam during the month. \$57,374.19 was obligated during the month.

(2) Renewed Ice and Vegetable Contracts for FLSG-A and extended the Forklift Rental Contract for one month.

e. Logistics

(1) Maintenance Situation. CG, FMFPac msg 161925Z Dec67 directed that all equipment deadlined in FLC shops beyond 30 days be evacuated to 3rd FSR. This resulted in a total of 517 items that it appeared would require evacuation at the inception of the program. Of this number, 218 were small or component type items that were evacuated under the rapid repair program. The remaining 299 major end items were reported as those tentatively requiring evacuation. Of the original 299 reported, 94 have either been repaired, have repairs in progress, or parts due imminently. The remaining 205 major items are presently in the process of being evacuated.

(2) Supply Situation. The month of December was highlighted by the planning and preparation phases of Operation Checkers placing

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emphasis on the realignment of Force Logistic Command's Force Logistic Support Groups to provide better logistics support to operating forces north within the ICTZ. In addition, there has been a greater effort set forth toward the resupply of Marine units at Khe Sanh.

(3) Col Co Fuel Complex. On 16 December 1967 the United States Navy took over control of the fuel farm at Col Co Island. Steel tanks are replacing the 10,000 gallon rubber tanks formerly used at Col Co. The capacities are as follows:

(4) Ammunition. During the month of December MAELU reworked a total of 80,000 rounds of 4.2 HE ammunition.

(5) Motor Transport. The status of the FMFPac repair/rebuild program for the month of December is as follows:

There was a quantity of 122 Fix and Do modification kits installed in the 5 ton multi-fuel engines during December.

(6) Ordnance. The M-16 rifles are being replaced in order to permit barrel removal on used rifles in order to establish a production base for Chrome Chambered barrels. During December there were over 10,000 barrels removed and evacuated and a like number will be evacuated during January 1968. The effort will remain in existence until all M-16 rifles have chromed chambers.

(7) Generators. The generator deadline is acceptable at the present. The FMFPac rebuild program has enhanced the generator readiness posture for this Command.

(8) Laundry Units. The repair parts for the expeditionary laundry units (M-532) have not arrived in-country as of yet. Forty-two units remain on administrative deadline.

(9) Special Programs. The Special Programs Office was established by Force Logistic Command, with the concurrence of FMFPac, on 10 November 1967. The functions of the Special Programs Office include the following:

- (a) Provide Customer Assistance teams to III MAF units.
- (b) Identify Force Logistic Command generated problems which affect Force Logistic Command customers and initiate corrective action.
- (c) Internal management improvement of Force Logistic Command.
- (d) Establishment of a Basic Organic Accounting Course for all III MAF units. The Special Programs Office is currently placing a maximum effort in the preparation of the Basic Accounting Course. The first class will commence on 1 February 1968. Each class will be of a three day period and approximately 175 students will attend monthly. This office has not been fully staffed as yet, and therefore has not been able to satisfy all assistance requests received to date. Force Logistic Command is currently awaiting CMC approval of a FMFPac message to be able to satisfy staffing requirements.

(10) Graves Registration. The Graves Registration Platoon processed 334 human remains during the month December 1967. Total human remains processed during 1967 was 4,411.

(11) Laundry. Force Logistic Command units laundered 269,329 lbs of laundry during the month of December 1967.

(12) Boot Repair. Force Logistic Command boot repair vans repaired 321 pairs of boots during the month of December 1967.

(13) Supply

(a) The main effort of the month was directed towards the cancellation of obligations over 90 days old. The total obligations dropped from 42,301 to 42,680 as a result of the cancellation run. Since then they have dropped to 39,637 a new low during the last several months.

(b) Ten daily update runs were processed during the month with a total of 51,022 requisitions processed, 28,232 receipts processed and 59,101 shipping mats produced.

(c) The monthly fill rate 62% also a new high.

(14) Line Haul. Round trip line haul operations on a daily basis to Phu Bai commenced to replace the long, bulky Rough Riders. The first round trip run was made on 19 December consisting of 20 task semitrailers. A level of 15-20 task vehicles is maintained to keep total number of vehicles in the convoy to 35 or less. 3rd Marine Division has the responsibility to haul the loaded trailers to Dong Ha where cargo for that location is moved to Phu Bai.

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(15) 6000 Pound Rough Terrain Forklifts. Assets of the 3rd Force Service Regiment in the quantity of 15 are being shipped to Force Logistic Command. To date 5 have been received by Force Logistic Command.

(16) Laundry Units Trailer Mounted M532. Distribution of Laundry Units has been made to Force Logistic Command organizations located at Danang, Chu Lai, Phu Bai and Dong Ha. Spare part provisioning has not been received.

(17) Central Power for Camp Books. Central Power using 750 KW Muse generators turned on in Camp Books on 20 December 1967. The entire Camp has not been connected to this power source, however, the main facilities now on central power include the CCP, PR&P, both messhalls, communications center, Supply Battalion cantonment area, Headquarters and Service Battalion cantonment area and the officers mess.

f. Civic Action.

(1) On 8 December 1967, The Commanding Officer, Supply Battalion/ 1st FSR assigned Civic Action responsibility for a new refugee camp in the Phu Loc area of Hoa Khanh Village. 3000 refugees from southern Quang Nam Province and the present refugee camp at Tiep Cu will be assigned to the new camp.

(2) On 11 December 1967, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 attended III MAF monthly PsyOps Conference. Agenda items included briefings by ICTZ Provincial PsyOps personnel and the formation of Provincial Joint Committees.

(3) On 22 December 1967, 3700 Christmas toys received from III MAF were distributed to units in Civil Affairs Area #5. Included were 1200 toys bought as part of III MAF volume purchase.

(4) On 23 December, 1200 small Christmas toys contributed to U. S. Army Advisors for distribution to dependents, widows and orphans of 1st Ranger Group, ARVN. Assistant G-5 attended the festivities.

(5) Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 attended the MACV-CORJS Advisor Orientation Course, Saigon from 17-23 December 1967. The course is of particular value for those working with CORDS and PsyOps.

g. Industrial Relations.

(1) On 3 December 1967, the IRO conducted a meeting of unit IRO's. Principal topic discussed was the phased hiring schedule for 408 LNC to fill "Civilianization" billets and the possible increase in the present LNC ceiling by 330. Nominations for employee TET awards were solicited.

(2) On 14 December 1967, the IRO attended Danang Joint Manpower Committee meeting. Discussion included a reconsideration of wages for personal service employees. The basic problem is the overpayment of housemaids by certain military installations - principally the Air Force. Force Logistic Command is well under the maximum (\$4800/month) presently advised by the Personal Services subcommittee.

(3) G-5 Section conducted one hour weekly class in Revolutionary Development, Psychological Operations and Industrial Relations for the Force Logistic Command NCO Leadership School.

(4) The total LNC strength as of 31 December 1967 is 636; the ceiling remains 650.

h. Chaplain.

(1) Rear Admiral James W. Kelly, U. S. Navy, Chief of Chaplains, visited the Force Logistic Command of 22 December 1967 and remained throughout the morning. Chaplain Kelly returned on 24 December and preached the sermon at the 1000 Protestant Divine Service. The Chapel was greatly appreciated by the Chief of Chaplains.

(2) Worship services for Protestant and Catholic personnel were conducted in all areas of the Command. Attendance has increased appreciably and good coverage is being provided by seven Chaplains.

(3) A similar increase has been noted in the area of personal counselling due to a wider coverage by the Chaplains and availability of all Chaplains.

(4) Bible Classes, mid week services, choir rehearsals, religious instructions and Personal response lectures were presented to all units.

(5) Civic action thru the G-5 and S-5 was maintained. Clothing, toys, and food items were delivered to orphanages and missions. Christmas parties were given in several areas for the orphanages. Packages recieved from the States for service personnel we distributed in many of the units. Many Christmas letters and cards were also distributed to Military personnel.
