PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

FLSU #1 continued to provide supply and maintenance support for 3rd MarDiv (FWD) and its supporting elements. This was in direct support of operations Kentucky V, Osceola, Neosho, and Napoleon. Support was also provided to the 1st Marine Regiment.

During the month of December there were only (2) two incidents of enemy artillery attacks. There was no equipment loss as a result of any enemy action. Personnel casualties were (1) one WIA minor.

The requirements for 972 material continued to increase. There were 4,539 S/T of material issued to 3rd MarDiv. Engineer Bns. There were no problems encountered in handling the increased material issues and receipts.

During the month, FLSU #1 civic action efforts focused upon repair and construction of homes in the hamlets of Luong An and Phuong Gia. Salvaged lumber materials and cement were obtained and used on this project. With labor provided by the indigenous personnel nine houses were repaired, three new ones constructed and work was begun on four additional houses.

Two Med Caps were conducted this month and approximately 120 civilian personnel were treated. Three 50.0 Cu ft boxes of clothing donated by U. S. civilians and some toys provided by the 9th Marines were distributed at the same time.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 2Dec67-A Rough Rider from Phu Bai arrived with Class II supplies and RUC gear.
- 5Dec67-One M35A1 FLSU #1 truck loaded with grade III ammo received sniper fire while traveling between the blow hole and the perimeter wire; the ammunition was ignited and the truck was completely destroyed. There was one minor casualty.
- 8Dec67-The EOD team went on a combat patrol to the village of Daido; One U. S. 155MM projectile and one 140MM Russian Rocket were destroyed.
- 11Dec67-Cua Viet received an undetermined amount of enemy incoming rds. (1) one compressor heavily damaged; No casualties.
- 15Dec67-The POL SEA LINE was inoperative, therefore, fuel was shuttled from ship to shore by "Mike" boats.
- 16Dec67-Cua Viet received approximately (130) rds. incoming enemy artillery; No casualties. There was slight damage to POL equipment.
- 24Dec67-The TAFDAS POL system at Dong Ha air strip was ignited and burned. FLSU #1 fire Dept. assisted in containing the fire. The cause of the fire is unknown.
- 25Dec67-B/Gen OLSON and Col J. R. JONES were aboard for Staff visit.
- 29Dec67-FLSU #1 received a Rough Rider from Phu Bai. There were eleven (11) "Row-Row Trailers" with the convoy. The eleven "Row-Row Trailers" were backloaded with Shop Stores retrograde and M.T. Maint. Vehicles.
