Narrative Summary

- 1. Effective 1 January 1967, FLSU #2 and FLSU #1 transferred administrative control of assigned bulk fuel personnel to the 7th Separate Bulk Fuel Company. The bulk fuel mission will continue to be under operational control of the respective units.
- 2. On 21 January 1967, the old ammunition supply point (ASP) #1 was vacated. Howevent of ammunition from ASP #2 continues with delays encountered due to mensoon weather and shortages of materials handling equipment.
- 3. On 22 January 1967, an inventory of all Class II supplies was commenced. Inventory was completed and adjustments effected by 31 January 1967.
- 4. On 22 January 1967, an increased T/O, T/E to expand supply-maintenance support for the Dong Ha (FLSU#1) TAOR was prepared.
- 5. During period 22-31 January plans were formulated and proposed to FLC to relocate Class I and V supply dumps at Dong Ha.

2. vil Affairs Programs

Efforts this month were concentrated on the Med Cap program, and the Chieu Hoi - TET campaign. Approximately 1800 patients were treated by unit corpsmen under the Med Cap program during January. The FLSU #2 Civil Affairs Team together with the Chieu Hoi Armed Propaganda Team and two corpsmen from "A" Third Medical Battalien formed a Chieu Hoi Psy-Ops Team. This team was notably successful in inducing over 40 ralliers to come into the Chieu Hoi program during January. Valuable intelligence information was obtained from these ralliers which was furnished to the Third Marine Division.
