PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. FLSG-Alpha continued to provide supply, maintenance and service support to the 3rd Marine Division and other Marine units in the Northern ICTZ. Logistic Support Units from FLSG-Alpha provided direct supply and maintenance support to Division units participating in Operations Cimmaron, Choctaw and Cumberland in addition to providing a Logistic Support Unit in the Khe Sanh area to support operations in that area. Within the Phu Bai area, the building program of FLSG-Alpha continues to provide needed buildings for supply storage facilities. During the month Supply Company moved into completed butler buildings Clothing and Medical Supply providing them with better working conditions, increased space and facilities. Personnel increases during the month greatly enhanced the capability of the Group to perform its mission.
2. FLSU One, located at the Dong Ha Combat base, continues to grow. This combat base is still expanding, and the facilities for storage and maintenance are being improved. Improvements in the perimeter defense occurred by increasing automatic weapons, placement of towers, and erection of double apron fences. An increase of personnel on the perimeter was necessary and was absorbed principally by 3rd Division unit rear echelons attached for duty within the FLSU-1 Sector of Defense. Progress in the new FLSU-1 construction site occurred. Continued improvements were made to internal defensive positions in anticipation of artillery attacks. Two artillery attacks occurred - both at Cua Viet. One attack resulted in no damages, the other three damaged three (3) 10,000 gal diesel tanks which were required to be replaced. During this period FLSU-1 supported Khe Sanh by loading 118 truckloads of cargo, principally ammo and POL on rough riders to Khe Sanh. This unit also moved approximately 500,000 lbs. of cargo, Class II, III, IV and V to the ISA, Shore Party for movements to Khe Sanh by helicopter. A new high in services rendered was achieved by the laundry unit with one serviceable washer and dryer. 900 lbs. a day of "D" Med and infantry units organizational items were laundered. Meanwhile the bakery, established under two tents with 6 ovens, attained a production of 4220 lbs. of bread per day. The bread shipments to Dong Ha were terminated and FLSU-1 assumed bread support for over 30 mess halls. A sod contract was let for beautification of the Dong Ha base and as a dust deterrent. Another ice contract was negotiated which made available a total of 50,000 lbs. of ice a day. During this period Vietnamese laborers were hired to bring the total to 13.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. a. **Mission** - To provide sustained combat service support to all III MAF units in the 3rd Marine Division area of operations from south of Phu Bai, north to the DMZ. Support includes supply of Classes I through V, including medical supplies, and third and limited fourth echelon maintenance for all ground equipment. Services provided include: explosive ordnance demolition teams; laundry service; bakery support; graves registration teams; shipping and receiving of all types of cargo via air, sea and surface transport means.
