PART II  
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. FLSG-Alpha continued to provide supply, maintenance and service support to the Third Marine Division and other Marine units in the Northern ICTZ. Logistic Support Units from FLSG-Alpha provided direct supply and maintenance support to Division units participating in Operations Shawnee, Choctaw, Prairie IV and Hickory in addition to providing a Logistic Support Unit in the Khe Sanh area to support operations in that area. Within the Phu Bai area, the building program of FLSG-Alpha continues to provide needed buildings for supply and maintenance facilities. During the month Maintenance Company moved into completed butler buildings providing them with better working conditions, increased space and facilities. Personnel increases during the month greatly enhanced the capability of the Group to perform its mission.

2. FLSU One, located at the Dong Ha Combat base, continues to grow. This combat base is still expanding, and the facilities for storage and maintenance are being improved. In order to improve the shop stores capability, five shop vans were received during the month. In addition, a field bakery was activated, and is producing 2300 pounds of bread a day for distribution to the units in the Dong Ha area. Uninterrupted supply and maintenance support was provided to all the units located at Camp Carroll, Gio Linh, Cam Lo, Con Tien and the Dong Ha Combat base by FLSU One. The sporadic mortar/rocket attacks experienced at this combat base have not affected the capability of FLSU One to perform its mission.
