

PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. FLSG-Alpha continued to provide supply and maintenance support for the 3d Marine Division and other Marine units in the Northern ICTZ. Logistic Support Units from FLSG-Alpha provided direct supply and maintenance support to Division units participating in Operations Kingfisher, Knox, ~~Liberty II~~, Osceola, Ardmore, Cove, Napoleon, and Neosho.
2. There were only two (2) incidents of enemy artillery attacks at FLSU-1. Combat losses or damage to equipment was as follows; (1) M422 Mighty Mite; (1) M-349 Reefer Van and (1) M109 Shop Van.
3. Favorable weather conditions throughout the month permitted an increase of supplies and equipment through the LSU Ramp. An average daily tonnage of 1,200 short tons was cleared by FLSU-1 ramp operations.
4. 972 Project supplies increased by 100% during the month. A minimum of problems was experienced in handling the increased work load due to the equipment support rendered by Shore Party, MCB #11 and 9th Motor Transport Battalion.
5. Material handling capability of FLSU-1 was increased due to the receipt of five (5) additional 6,000 lbs. forklifts.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. a. Mission - To provide sustained combat services support to all III MAF units in the 3d Marine Division area of operations from south of Phu Bai, north to the DMZ.
