PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. FLSG-Alpha continued to provide supply and maintenance support for the 3d Marine Division and other Marine units in the Northern ICFZ. Logistic Support Units from FLSG-Alpha provided direct supply and maintenance support to Division units participating in Operations Granite, Kingfisher, Fremont, Formation Leader, Knox, Liberty II, Medina, Osceola, and Ardmore.
2. A significant decrease in enemy artillery attacks occurred during October, with a total of Fifteen (15) incidents. Combat Losses to supplies and equipment consisted of the following; 10,000 gallons AvGas; 2200 gallons of drummed Diesel fuel and MGas. Two (2) 10,000 gallon fuel tanks and one (1) $\frac{1}{4}$ ton Fire truck. In addition, the following items suffered minor damage, one (1) M-60 Machine Gun and one (1) 6,000 lb. Rough Terrain Forklift.
3. FLSU-1 established a bulk fuel installation at Site X-Ray. This facility has an initial capacity of 240,000 gallons of Class III products and is supporting ground and air operations in that area. Operational planning for and construction of an ASP with a storage capacity of approximately 2,000 Short Tons progressed rapidly.
4. During the month, significant progress was made at FLSU-1 in the area of construction with the completion of a new messhall; two (2) new ammunition storage berms. Two (2) additional reefers were provided to Graves Registration. Concrete slabs were poured for additional structures at Phu Bai.
5. Favorable weather conditions throughout the month permitted increased input of supplies and equipment at the LCU Ramp and by air at Dong Ha. In addition, FLSG-A received and dispatched several rough-rider truck convoys of over one-hundred (100) trucks carrying RUC cargo from Force Logistic Command in Danang to units in Phu Bai and Dong Ha areas, and returning retrograde cargo to Danang.

1. a. Mission - To provide sustained combat services support to all III MAF units in the 3d Marine Division area of operations from south of Phu Bai, north to the DMZ. Support includes supply of Class I through V, including medical supplies, and third and limited fourth echelon maintenance for all ground equipment. Services provided include; explosive ordnance demolition teams, laundry service; bakery support; graves registration teams; shipping and receiving of all types of cargo via air, sea and surface transport means.
