PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During this reporting period, Force Logistic Support Group - BRAVO continued to provide supply and maintenance support and other services to the units located in the Chu Lai Combat Base. The miscellaneous services provided remain constant with an improved supply level of flour resulting in a full issue of bread being issued as of 1 Feb 1967. "A" rations are still being received in insufficient quantities and requires two or more items being combined to constitute a single ration. There is also a shortage of frozen vegetables.

2. The building program within FLSG-BRAVO complex continues at a highly satisfactory pace. The Commanding Officer and the S-2/3 Staff Section occupy the newly constructed quonset huts and the remainder of the staff will move into their new quonsets during the month of February. Work on maintenance buildings, storage areas and other facilities continue as programmed.

a. Personnel. During this reporting period, this Command experienced the loss of Marine Corps Personnel for the fourth consecutive month. Morale within the Command remains high.

b. Administration. No significant changes.

c. Intelligence. No significant changes.

d. Training

(9) 1000 Inch Range was utilized 16 days during January by this Command to zero T/O weapons, set battle sights and test fire M-60 machine guns.

e. Special Operations. Operation SIERRA continued through 23 January. The LSA in direct support of operation SIERRA remained in position and the stock levels were increased in order to support Operation DESOTA which commenced on 26 January.

f. Command Relations. No significant changes.

g. Equipment. Nothing significant.

h. Logistics. Nothing significant.

i. Community Relations

(1) Relations with the Vietnamese civilians in the Chu Lai New Life Hamlet continues to be excellent. The FLSG-BRAVO Civil Affairs Officer attended a meeting and banquet given by the Parent's Club of the Chu Lai Primary School.

(2) The crossbreed of American/Vietnamese strain pigs now total 19 at the Chu Lai New Life Hamlet Pig farm.

(3) The Civic Action team has initiated a cleanup program to rid Chu Lai New Life Hamlet of trash and garbage. Thus far the program has been very successful and has the full support and cooperation of the villagers and Hamlet Chiefs.

(4) The FLSG-BRAVO MED CAP personnel treated 750 patients and gave 500 immunizations to the personnel of Chu Lai New Life Hamlet.

j. Communications

(1) During the month of January 1967, the Radio Section provided communications for the LSA in support of Operation SIERRA. This Operation ended the 23d of January, and the Radio Section continues to provide communications support for Operation DESOTA which commenced on 26 Jan 1967.

(2) During the reporting period the Message Center processed a total of 4,750 messages, which includes messages incoming and outgoing, guard mail, courier, teletype on-line encrypted, and US mail messages. This Unit's Message Center has transmitted over 15,623 IBM cards and received over 22,930 via the IBM Transceiver. Another IBM Transceiver has been added to the Message Center and it has proven to be very useful as a back-up machine. Presently the main problem with the Transceiver Circuit is line noise. DaNang Control is aware of this condition and is trouble shooting for a way to improve or eliminate the problem. One AN/GGC-3 Teletype Perforator/Reperforator was loaned to FLSU-2 on a temporary basis.

(2) The Wire Section has relocated some of the interior lines of this Command during the reporting period, also relocated three Alert lines in the Supply Company area and one Alert line in the Maintenance Company area. One SB-86 Switchboard was installed in the Bravo Board to replace three SB-22s. The Wire Section also supported Operation SIERRA and is now supporting Operation DESOTA.

(4) During the reporting period the Maintenance Section performed routine 2d echelon maintenance and processed 170 work orders. Facilities have been made secure, allowing the trouble-shooting and repair of KW-7 Cryptographic equipment. The modification of the heavy print spring on the TGG-14 has proved to be worthwhile in the operation of this machine.
