

- (1) Legal Assistance. Legal assistance was rendered in 93 cases during the month of August 1968.
- (2) Legal Lectures. Two lectures were given during the month of August 1968.
- (3) Disciplinary Court-Martial Cases: A total of 43 courts-martial were tried within FIC during August.

c. Purchasing and Contracting. The Purchasing and Contracting Officer purchased various items in Vietnam on the open market for the support of military forces in Vietnam during the month. A total of \$217,258.05 was obligated during the month.

d. Logistic

ONFIDENTIAL

- (1) Support for Combat Operations: During the month of August the Force Logistic Command continued to provide support to those combat troops operating in the ICTZ. The ISU at FOB Stud was remained FOB Vandegrift. This ISU continued to support Task Force Hotel. The ISU's located on Hill 55 and at An Hoa continued to provide support for Marines operating in the Goi Noi Island area. These ISU's provide support for Operations Mameluke Thrust and Sussex Bay. Continuing operations in the ICTZ throughout August were Operations Napoleon/Saline, Kentucky, Lancaster II, Scotland II, Nevada Eagle, Jeb Stewart III, Houston, Mameluke Thrust, Wheeler/Whallows and Burlington Trail. Operations Sussex in Quang Nam Province and Champaign Grove in Quang Tin Provice were initiated during the month of August.
- (2) The integrated support situation for U. S. Army forces in the ICTZ proceeded smoothly and presented relatively few problems.
- (3) The Force Logistic Command provided assistance to the First Marine Division in the preparation of RLT-27 major T/E equipment for redeployment. Such assistance consisted of spraying and dipping ordnance T/E equipment and packing and preserving this equipment for further shipment to CONUS and Hawaii.
- (4) Services: During the month of August, Force Logistic Command units processed 175,228 pounds of laundry. The Graves Registration Platoon processed 621 human remains.
- (5) Central Control Point Operations: During the month of August, 20 computer supply updates were processed. A total of 58,275 requisitions and 25,723 receipts were processed and 47,943 shipping mats were produced. The total number of transactions that were processed for the month was 818,027. The fill rate was 53% with the fill rate for RO items being 55%.

(6) Rations.

- a. During the month of August, Force Logistic Command bakeries produced 1,002,843 pounds of bread broken down as follows:
 - (1) Danang 533,480 lbs
 - (2) Phu Bai 218,559 lbs
 - (3) Dong Ha 250,804 1bs
- b. During the month of August, 6,562,416 pounds of ice were procured and 782,740 pounds were produced for the Force Logistic Command. These totals are:
 - (1) Rations Co, Supply Bm.
 - (a) Produced 694,740
 - (b) Procured 1, 167, 452



(2) FLSG-Allpha 590,645 lbs procured.

(3) FISG-Bravo 4,804,319 lbs procured.

- (4) FOB Vandegrift 88,000 lbs produced.
- (7) Ammunition: Except for minor problems, ammunition assets were equally distributed to meet commitments. During the month of August MAREU reworked 3,575 rounds of 155mm WP, 10,373 rounds of Fuze M514A1, and 167 rounds of 105mm HE. The total Class V expenditures for the month was \$35,766,012.07. A total tonnage of 44,889 short tons was handled by the Ammunition Company, Supply Battalion at ASP #1 and ASP #2 for a daily average of 1,496 short tons.
- (8) Fuel: During the month of August the overall posture remained good. The Cua Viet River POL movement by burge was slow due to damage to barges and lack of sufficient boats to move POL and rock barges. Current POL barge movements are barely keeping up with usage.

FISG-Bravo started pumping JP-4 and AvGas into U. S. Army owned steel tanks at Quang Tri on 15 August. All collapsible JP-4 and AvGas tanks-were withdrawn from Quang Tri complex on 21 August.

The First Marine Air Wing increased their JP-4 capacity at An Hoa to 40,000 gallons on 21 August.

A drawdown of supplies and removal of equipment was started at Wunder Beach on 25 August. Present capacity has decreased to AvGas 10m, JP-4 100m, MoGas 50m, and Diesel 50m.

The Cua Viet Fuel farm was hit by enemy artillery on 26 August, the following equipment was destroyed:

- 2 RC-292 Antennas
- 1 EE-8 Telephone
- 8 4x50 Discharge Hoses

On 27 August the Cua Viet Fuel farm installed an additional 6" bottom line. Presently the Cua Viet has two 6" and one 4" bottom lines.

The U.S. Navy attempted removing a 6" bottom line at Wunder Beach but was unable to do so and the line was capped off on 13 August.

- (9) M109 Product Improvement Kit: The installation of the M109 Product Improvement Kit, modification of the 155mm Howitzer SP, was completed on 13 August
- (10) M16Al Rifle: The Force Logistic Command is now in the process of issuing chrome chambered M16Al rifles to the First Marine Air Wing.
- (11) Artillery Deadline: During the month of August 117 artillery pieces were deadlined for 3rd and 4th echelon maintenance. Of the 117 pieces, 111 were removed from deadline.
- (12) Density Increase of III MAF Combat Essential Equipment: For command and management attention the increased density of III MAF combat essential equipment is noted:

e. Civic Action

- (1) 12 August 1968 Conducted semi-amnual inspection of 3rd Military Police Battalion. The inspection was satisfactory.
- (2) 15 August 1968 Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 attended a ribbon cutting ceremony at Phuoc Xuan Hamlet in commemoration of the opening of a sewing school building. The building was a self-help project with the materials being provided by Supply Battalion and the labor by local hamlet residents. The local hamflet chief, Father Dam, presided at the ceremony and hosted a Buncheon for invited guests.
- (3) 17 August 1968 The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 attended an Province Civil Affaysis Conference at Hoi Am, hosted by CORDS personnel. Military and civil problems relative to the overall revolutionary development program in Quang Nam Province were discussed.
- (4) 22 August 1968 The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 attended an IRO conference at III MAF. Representatives from IRD Danang and all III MAF units conducting IRO programs were in attendence. Mutual problems were discussed and workable solutions were submitted. A new AIK fund was instituted which may be used to pay for labor costs in one-day hire projects.
- (5) A total of \$8,498.90 was received in donations for the Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital. This sum included both in-country and out-of-country donations.
- (6) 30 August 1968 15 G. P. tents (from salvage) and 200 reconditioned cots were provided to Reverand Gordon H. Smith as a prelude to moving the Happy Haven Leprosarium from south of Marble Mountain area to the northern border of Hoa Heip Village. Viet Cong terrorist activities have made their present location untenable.



f. Industrial Relations

- (1) 5 August 1968 Industrial Relations Officer and NCOIC attended Manpower meeting at CORDS, Danzag. Major items discussed were problems relating to procurring and maintaining VNAF passes for LNC to work aboard Danzag Air Base.
- (2) 12 August 1968 Semi-Annual Inspection of the 3rd Military Police Battalion Industrial Relations Program. Grade was satisfactory with minor discrepancies. Discrepancies stem from hiring prior to completion of proper paper work.
- (3) 22 August 1968 Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5 and Command Industrial Relations Officer attended III MAF IRO meeting. The meeting was the first of its kind set up to air common IRO problems and to establish closer working relations with IRD, Damang. A fund of \$175,000 VN will be alloted to FIC for ODHIRE projects.
- (4) 26 August 1968 Semi-Annual Inspection of FISG-B, Supply Company, Chu Lai was satisfactory. Pass system somewhat disrupted by Gate MP's. Recommended changing passes at Industrial Relations office for better control.






