b. Legal

- (1) Legal Assistance. Legal assistance was rendered in 96 cases during the month of July 1968.
- (2) <u>Legal Lectures</u>. Two lectures were given during the month of July 1968.
- (3) <u>Disciplinary Court-Martial Cases</u>: A total of 42 courts-martial were tried within FIC during July.



c. <u>Purchasing and Contracting</u> The Purchasing and Contracting Officer purchased various items in Vietnam on the open market for the support of military forces in Vietnam during the month. A total of \$121,489.62 was obligated during the month.

d. <u>Communication-Electronics</u>

- (1) On 22 July 1968 two KY-3 Secure Voice Telephone Equipments were installed, one in the Chief of Staff's office and one in the Logistic Operation Center. These installations will provide Top Secret Secure Voice communications with any point in the world upon activation of the secure voice switchboard in Danang. This board is scheduled for activation in approximately two months.
- (2) The rocket attacks of 23 and 24 July cut several pairs on the M-8 and M-9 cables which were subsequently repaired by 5th Comm Bn.
- (3) On 28 July an SB-86 switchboard at the III MAF Transient Facility became operational. This switchboard permits direct contact between various representatives at the Transient Facility and their parent organizations.

e. Logistic.

- (1) Support for Combat Operations: During the month of July the Force Logistic Command continued to provide support to those combat troops operating in the ICTZ. The establishment of an LSU at FOB Stud was completed to support Task Force Hotel. The LSU's located on Hill 55 and at an Hoa continued to provide support for Marines operating in the Goi Noi Island area. These LSU's provided support for Operations Mameluke Thrust and Allen Brook/Swift Play. Continuing operations in the ICTZ throughout the month of July were Operations Napoleon/Saline, Kentucky, Lancaster II, Scotland II, Nevada Eagle, Jeb Stewart III, Houston, Mameluke Thrust, Allen Brook/Swift Play, Wheeler/Wallewa, and Burlington Trail.
- (2) The integrated support situation for U. S. Army forces in the ICTZ proceeded smoothly and presented relatively few problems.
- (3) <u>Services</u>: During the month of July, Force Logistic Command units processed 155,800 pounds of laundry. The Graves Registration Platoon processed 571 human remains.
- (4) <u>Central Control Point Operations</u>: During the month of July, 20 computer supply updates were processed. A total of 47,038 requisitions and 22,278 receipts were processed and 71,498 shipping mats were produced. The total number of transactions processed for the month was 1,101,421. The fill rate was 55% with the fill rate for RO items being 59%.



5. Rations:

- a. During the month of July, Force Logistic Command bakeries produced a total of 1,040,799 pounds of bread broken down as follows:

 - (1) Danang 496,609 lbs(2) Phu Bai -307,986 lbs
 - (3) Dong Ha =236.204 lbs
- b. During the month of July, 5,089,149 pounds of ice were procured and 922,116 pounds were produced for Force Logistic Command broken down as follows:
 - (1) Rations Co, Supply Bn.
 - (a) Produced 811,116 lbs
 - (b) Produced = 729,935 lbs
 - (2) FLSG Alpha procured 596,744 lbs.
 - (3) FLSG Brave procured 3,762,470 lbs.
 - (4) FOB Stud produced 111,000 lbs.
- 6. Ammunition. Except for minor problems, ammunition assets were equally distributed to meet commitments. During the month of July MAREU reworked 3,265 rounds of 4.2" ammunition. They also segregated 167 rounds of 4.2", segregated 255 rounds of 155mm ammunition, overhauled by painting, cleaning and stenciling 3,504 rounds of 155mm ammunition. The total Class V expenditures for the month of July was \$38,477,233.28. A total tonnage of 42,564 short tons was handled by the Ammunition Company, Supply Battalion at ASP#1 and ASP #2 for a daily average of 1,373 short tons.
- 7. Fuel. During the month of July the overall posture remained excellent. As of 31 July, three 10,000 barrels and one 3,000 barrel steel tanks were completed at Quang Tri. Two 10,000 barrels and one 3,000 barrel tanks have been water checked.
- On 1 July the Cua Viet fuel facility was hit by enemy artillery resulting in the following losses:
 - 4x25 Suction hose's 6
 - 4x50 Discharge hoses

- 8. M109 Product Improvement Kit: To date there have been 38 Product Improvement Kits installed on the M109, SP 155mm Howitzer.
- 9. M101A1/M114A1 Rebuild Program: This program is instrumental in part for the sustained rate of low deadline of artillery within III MAF.

- 10. M16A1 Rifle: There is a sufficient number of Chrome barreled rifles on hand to fully equip the 1st MarDiv and 3rd MarDiv.
- 11. Artillery Deadline: The highest number of deadline artillery in any one month during the calendar year occurred this past month. It is of commendable significance to note that through the combined efforts of maintenance and supply support, of the 122 artillery pieces deadline at one time or another during the month, 115 were repaired and returned to service.
- 12. Density Increase of III MAF Combat Essential Equipment: For Command and management Attention the increased density of III MAF Combat Essential Equipment is noted:

c. Civic Action.

- (1) 8 July 1968-CO, Supply Company (=), FLSG-B presented a check for \$1000 from the unit chapel fund, to the Commanding General for the Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital.
- (2) 10 July MC/S, G=5 attended a III MAF G=5 conference. Topics included WALT Scholarship funding, logistic support, mid=autumn festival and Christmas/TET planning and civil affairs reporting.
- (3) 10 July- A one-hour PSYOPS orientation lecture was given by the AC/S, G-5 to the 1st MP Battalion officer/SNCO School. The Battalion is increasing its use of PSYOPS at the company level and had requested an introductory briefing.

- (4) 15 July- Semi-Annual Inspection of 1st MP Battalion. The inspection was satisfactory. Extension of civic action responsibility to the company level was noteworthy as was the degree of command interest shown in civil affairs/PSYOPS matters.
- (5) 18 July- AC/S, G-5 purchased 114 hospital beds for \$7315 from the Gen-Medical Supply Company, Naha, Okinawa. Delivery is expected in mid-September through 3rd FSR.
- (6) 27 July AC/S, G 5 attended a meeting in Danang at the invitation of Mr. Thien Ke, a member of the VN legislature from Danang. The total effects of civic action in the Danang area was discussed by local civic action officers and Mr. Ke.
- (7) AC/S, G-5 continued to present a one-hour lecture to the NCO Leader-ship School on Revolutionary Development, PSYOPS, and Industrial Relations.

d. INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

- (1) 11 July The Industrial Relations NCO attended the Danang Manpower Coordinating Committee meeting. The main topic of discussion was establishment of a centralized hiring system for Danang, Phu Bai and Chu Lai areas. Also discussed were Vietnamese-American relations. All units were asked by the American Consulate to keep him informed on problems involving the acquisitition of VNAF passes.
- (2) 19 July- The Industrial Relations NCO attended a Special Manpower Coordinating Committee meeting called to discuss the problem of obtaining MSS and VNAF clearances. The VNAF clearances system remains a problem and results in few Vietnamese attempting to seek employment on the Danang Air Base complex.
- (3) 31 July 45 LNC have been hired to fill Civilianization billets during the month of July. To date a total of 72 LNC have been hired under the Civilianization Program. A total of 706 appropriated fund employees were on board at the end of the month.
