NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. FLSG-A continued to provide limited supply and maintenance support to Marine Corps units in the Phu Bai area.

2. During December, FLSG-A continued transfer of functions to the Army (26th GenSptGrp). On 13 December 1968, the Army took over the Bakery and Ice-cream Plant; on 26 December the Army took over the Messhall functions.

3. Civil Affairs held thirty MedCaps during the month of December, treating 4,462 civilians.

1. a. Mission - To provide service support to Marine Corps Units in the Phu Bai area. Support includes supply of Class II and third echelon maintenance for all ground equipment for Marine Corps Units.
