- 1. FISG-A continued to provide supply and maintenance support for 1st and 3rd Marine Division and Army units (less maintenance) in the Northern ETZ. Logistic Support Units from FISG-A provided direct support to Operations Scotland and Hue City.
- 2. The Hue Ramp was reopened for receipt and shipment of supplies and equipment on 14 February 1968.
