

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Electronic Maintenance Platoon has received two additional Shop Stores Clerks from Dong Ha. Received also, 550 secondary repairable items on site for Shop Stores support.

A second shop building is being constructed for Engineer Maintenance Platoon on the site of the destroyed Electronic Maintenance building.

Ordnance Maintenance Platoon has shipped four 105mm Howitzers to FMFPac Rebuild Program. Eight M-109 How(SP) and eight M48A3 Tanks have been shipped under the Replacement and Evacuation Program. Two M98, 107mm Howtars were sent to MCL00 as excess.

Motor Transport Maintenance Platoon has shipped 105 vehicles this period. The construction of a new inspection shack, and an Organic dispatch shack have been completed. 396 items have been exchanged through the DX program.

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Supply Platoon:

The Supply Platoon continued Class II and IV supply support to all supported units. Approximately 200 tons of material was moved to the new RSA at Quang Tri. This completes the move of all Class II material and 25% of the Class IV material to be moved to Quang Tri. The First increment of supplies, Federal Groups 00 through 24 were inventoried and reported to the CCP but have not been mechanized as of this report. Those items within the first three increments are being handled under mechanized procedure while the remainder of the account is being processed manually.

Shop Stores Platoon:

Shop Stores continues its support of repair parts to the individual Maintenance Repair Shops within Maintenance Company, FLSG-Bravo. During December, a recomputation of the RO/ROP was conducted pertaining to 7509 line items in Shop Stores. A wall to wall location verification was held on all stocked repair parts and Secondary Repairable Items.

Ration Platoon:

On 10 December 1968, the Ration Platoon assumed Class I support of all Army and Marine Corps units in Northern I Corps as a result of the Army 26th Support Group moving to Phu Bai from Quang Tri.
