PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During July 1966, FLSG-8 continued to provide logistic support for the 3rd Marine Division and supporting elements, and Task Force Hotel, in direct support of operations Kentucky V, Lancaster II, Scotland II, Rice, and Napoleon/Saline.

Bread production increased 50%, TERC's received increased 21% and EOD destruction of Class V, Grade III again doubled.

Despite nine incidents of hostile rocket and artillery attacks that caused damage to group assets during the month, support by the group was not curtailed. River traffic increased from a daily average thru put of 1,244.9 short tons in June to a daily average thru put of 1,403.6 short tons during July.

The group shipped 499 M22A1's to Danang during July as a result of the M22A1 vehicle replacement program.

The group only had two wounded during July, both of them medevaced. There were no KIA's during July.

The group's civic action program was very active during July. Construction was completed on the well and orphanage for Deng Ha along with sanitary facilities for the orphanage. Construction of six homes in the villages of Luong An and Phong Gia was completed. Two Buddhist Temples in the village of Luong An were repaired and construction of a rectory for the Catholic Church in Deng Ha was initiated. Six medcaps were conducted in the villages of Luong An, Phong Gia, and Deng Ha with good results.

Approximately 32 rounds of 102MM and 122MM rockets were received by LSU STUD at 1315. There was one Bravo casualty redevaced.
