

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During June 1968, FLSG-B continued to provide logistic support for the 3rd Marine Division and supporting elements, and Task Force Hotel, in direct support of operations Kentucky V, Lancaster II, Scotland II, Rice and Napoleon/Saline.

Personal effects shipments again showed an increase of 27%, laundry processed and MUD destruction of Class V, Grade III doubled and the group began production of ice at LSU STUD. More than 7000 short tons of supplies and over 540,000 gallons of fuel were moved by rough rider convoy to the LSU at STUD during June 1968. The group's new bakery became fully operational with a capacity of 300,000 pounds of bread per month.

Despite 14 incidents of hostile rocket and artillery attacks that caused considerable damage to group assets during the month, support by the group was not measurably curtailed. The group lost Division augmentation support on the perimeter during the month. River traffic again declined from a daily average thru put of 1,432.7 Short Tons in May to a daily average thru put of 1,294.9 short tons in June.

The group lost 10,555 short tons of Class V when the Dong Ha Combat base ASB was destroyed by enemy action on 20 June 1968.

The group suffered 17 wounded in action of which 6 were medevac's. There were no KIA's during June.

The groups civic action program was active during June. Work was continued on the well and orphanage for Dong Ha. Construction of 15 homes in the villages of Luong An and Phong Gia was completed. Nine medcaps were conducted in the villages of Luong An, Phong Gia, and Dong Ha with good results.

Approximately 8 rounds of enemy artillery were received by Quang Tri at 2330. Bravo casualties: 3 WIA (1 medevac).. Bravo damage: Destroyed: 3 sections of 4" x 58' discharge hose.

24 Jun 68 Approximately 25 rounds of enemy artillery were received by Cua Viet at 0015. There were no Bravo casualties. Bravo damage: Destroyed: 2 10,000 fuel bladders, 4 sections of 4" x 25' suction hose.

- 29 Jun 68 Approximately 40 rounds of enemy mortars were received by the LSU STUD convoy at 1145 while enroute to STUD. There were no Bravo casualties or damage.
- 30 Jun 68 Approximately 7 rounds of enemy artillery were received by Cua Viet at 1120. There were no Bravo casualties. Bravo damage: Destroyed: 2 sections of 4" x 50' discharge hose, 3 sections of 4" x 25' suction hose.
