

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During October 1968, FLSG-B continued to provide logistic support for the Third Marine Division and supporting elements, and Task Force Hotel, in direct support of operations Kentucky V, Lancaster II, Scotland II, and Napoleon/Saline.

Ice cream production tripled, laundry production increased 40%, Shop Stores demands increased 27%, and the Shop Stores fill rate increased 5%.

There were seven incidents of hostile artillery and mortar attacks that caused minor damage to group assets which did not curtail support by the group. River traffic increased from a daily average thru put of 1,036.0 short tons in September to a daily average thru put of 1,465.4 short tons during October although there were seven days of relatively light tonnage received.

The group expended over 9,000 man hours on contact team support during the month of October 1968.

The group had one KIA and one WIA during the attack on the 30th of October when a direct hit was scored on the Commanding Officers office.

The group's civic action program was active during October. Construction of the new wing for the Dong Ha orphanage was completed and rebuilding of the village of Trung Chi was continued.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 7 Oct 68 An FMFPac Inspection Team arrived, inspected, and departed.
- 10 Oct 68 Reduced support of Class II items to Priority O2 requisitions and commenced construction of warehouse aids and started positioning supplies at the RSA site Quang Tri Combat Base.
- 14 Oct 68 The daily Dong Ha/Vandegrift resupply convoy was cancelled due to a bridge being washed out on Route #9.
- The Dong Ha/Quang Tri road was closed due to flooding.
- 15 Oct 68 The daily Dong Ha/Vandegrift resupply convoy was again cancelled due to the bridge being out on Route #9.
- 17 Oct 68 Approximately 16 rounds of mortars were received by Vandegrift at 0640. There were no Bravo casualties or damage.
- The daily Dong Ha/Vandegrift resupply convoy was again cancelled due to the bridge being out on Route #9.
- 18 Oct 68 BGen OLSON and BGen FEELEY aboard for an orientation visit of the new Commanding General, Force Logistic Command, BGen FEELEY.
- 20 Oct 68 26th GenSuptGrp, USA assumed responsibility for issue of "R" rations to Quang Tri Combat Base and south.
- 22 Oct 68 Approximately 12 rounds of 130mm artillery were received by Dong Ha at 1340. There were no Bravo casualties. Bravo damage:
- Damaged: 2 M48 Tanks - R&E  
2 M109 SP Guns - R&E
- Approximately 2 rounds of 130mm artillery were received by Dong Ha at 1600. There were no Bravo casualties or damage.
- 23 Oct 68 259th QMBn, USA assumed operation of the Quang Tri Combat Base gasoline station.
- 25 Oct 68 Restored full support to all units and continued construction and movement of supplies to the new RSA at Quang Tri Combat Base
- 27 Oct 68 Mr PECK, civilian technical representative from Consolidated Diesel, arrived to assist in modifying the PU-668 Generators.

28 Oct 68 Approximately 9 rounds of 130mm artillery were received by Cua Viet at 1510. There were no Bravo casualties or damage.

29 Oct 68 Mr CARPENTER, generator technician, arrived to inquire into generator maintenance programs.

Approximately 5 rounds of either 85mm or 130mm artillery were received by Cua Viet at 2100. There were no Bravo casualties or damage.

30 Oct 68 Approximately 10 rounds of probable 85mm artillery were received by Cua Viet at 1510. There were no Bravo casualties or damage.

Approximately 48 rounds of 130mm artillery were received by Dong Ha at 1640. There was one Bravo KIA and one Bravo WIA. Bravo damage:
