NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During this reporting period, Supply Company (Rein), Force Logistic Support Group Bravo, continues to provide the necessary Logistics Support for units within the Chu Lai Combat Base.

2. During the month of August 1968, the Aid Station treated three hundred and eleven (311) persons and administered one hundred and fifty seven (157) immunizations.

The Civil Affairs Section treated twenty six (26) Vietnamese personnel.

3. The building program within the Supply Company continues with the first increment of the current construction at the new Ammunition Supply Point which is ninety two percent complete.

i. Community Relations:

1. The Civil Affairs Section presently employs 99 Vietnamese civilians on Organizational Maintenance funds and 6 on non-appropriated funds.

j. Communications:

1. Maintenance Section. The maintenance section processed a total of 7 work orders, 2 of the work orders were completed in the shop and five were forwarded to the next highest echelon. A constant surveillance was maintained over the teletype and autodin throughout the month.

2. Wire Section. The wire section maintained the security loop lines and manned the security switchboard on a twenty-four hour per day basis. Additionally the wire line from ammo dump office to S-4 office was relaid. Put in one intercomm system for S-1, held maintenance repair on security lines from COC to Americal Support Division bunker 225 and 226.

3. Radio Section. The radio section continued to man the Force Logistics Command net and the Sub-Sector and Chu Lai Defense Radio Nets. Preventive maintenance was held on all equipment on a daily and weekly basis.

4. Message Center. During the month the section processed a total of 729 messages: 613 incoming and 116 outgoing. A total of 18,974 cards were processed on the data circuit: 5,605 incoming and 13,369 outgoing. Down time for the month amounted to a total of 109 hours and 35 minutes: 10 hours and 9 minutes can be attributed to power failure and the remainder to equipment problems here and the Force Logistics Command Message Center.
