NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During this reporting period, Supply Company (Rein), Force Logistic Support Group Bravo, continued to provide the necessary Logistics Support and limited maintenance support for units within the Chu Lai Combat Base.

2. During the month of July 1968, the Aid Station treated two hundred and forty nine (249) persons and administered three hundred and ninety nine (399) immunizations.

The Civil Affairs Section treated forty four (44) Vietnamese personnel.

3. The building program within Supply Company continues with the first increment of the current construction at the new Ammunition Supply Point, which is ninety percent complete.

4. Supply Company Civil Affairs Program was terminated 31 July 1968, its responsibilities have been jointly assumed by the U.S. Army Americal Division and by U.S. Marine Air Groups 12 and 13.

5. On 25 July 1968, the U.S. Army Americal Division purchased the Officer, Staff NCO, and Enlisted service clubs which were operated by Supply Company for the FLC Club System.

6. Effective 20 July 1968 Supply Company's third echelon maintenance mission was assumed by Maintenance Battalion.
