3. The building program within the Supply Company continues with the first increment of the current construction at the new Ammunition Supply Point ready and complete project is 96 percent complete.

j. Community Relations:

1. The Civil Affairs Section presently employs 92 Vietnamese civilians on Organizational Maintenance funds and 8 non-appropriated funds.

k. Communications:

1. Maintenance Section: The maintenance section processed a total of 6 new work orders during the month, 5 of these items were repaired and returned to the using section. 1 item was forwarded to the next higher echelon adjacent to the Message Center taking over the responsibilities of the Crypto equipment. A constant maintenance surveillance was maintained on teletype Crypto equipment throughout the month. All IBM equipment have been relocated by Force Logistic Command.

2. Radio Section: The radio section continued to man the Force Logistics Command Net and the Sub-sector II and Chu Lai Defense Radio Nets. The radio operators at COC still monitor Chu Lai Defense Radio Net. Preventive Maintenance was held on all equipment on a daily and weekly basis.

3. Message Center Section: During the month the section processed a total of 839 Messages; 726 incoming and 113 outgoing. A total of 718 cards were processed on the data circuit; 213 incoming and 505 outgoing. The down time for the month amounted to a total of 55 hours and 35 minutes; 1 hour and 30 minutes can be attributed to power failure and the remainder to equipment problems here and at the Force Logistics Command Message Center.

4. Wire Section: The Wire section maintained the security loop lines and manned the security switchboard on a 24 hour a day basis. Cable maintenance was performed on all installed cables. PM on all wire equipment on a weekly basis, Additionally a line linking S-4 with the New Ammo Supply Point and a new wire loop for the Supply Section Area were laid.
