NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During this reporting period, Supply Company (Rein), Force Logistic Support Group Bravo, continues to provide the necessary Logistics Support for units within the Cho Lai Combat Base.
2. During the month of September 1968, the Aid Station treated three hundred and thirty six (336) persons and administered one hundred and seven (107) immunizations.  
  
The Civil Affairs Section treated thirty one (31) Vietnamese personnel.
3. The building program within the Supply Company continues with the first increment of the current construction at the new Ammunition Supply Point ready and complete project is 96 percent complete.
4. On 7 September 1968, Service and Support Section was disbanded. The MHE of this section now comes under the cognizance of the Motor Transport Section. The water point, laundry, carpenter shop and electrician now work under the Logistic Section.

During the period covered by this report, Ammunition Section continued to operate both Class V and Class V (A) ammunition dumps on a 24 hour a day basis. j. Community Relations:

1. The Civil Affairs Section presently employs 99 Vietnamese civilians on Organizational Maintenance funds and 6 non-appropriated funds.

k. Communications:

1. Maintenance Section: The maintenance section processed a total of 7 new work orders during the month; One of these items were repaired and returned to the using section. Six items were forwarded to the next higher echelon of repairs. In addition, a constant maintenance surveillance was maintained on teletype and autodin circuits throughout the month. In addition, second and third echelon maintenance was performed on all communication equipment.

2. Radio Section: The radio section continued to man the Force Logistics Command Net and the Sub-sector II and Chu Lai Defense Radio Net. Preventive maintenance was held on all equipment on a daily and weekly basis.

3. Message Section: During the month the section processed a total of 738 messages; 662 incoming and 76 outgoing. A total of 3,193 cards were processed on the data circuit; 1,234 incoming and 1,959 outgoing. The down time for the month amounted to a total of 334 hours and 20 minutes; 8 hours and 20 minutes can be attributed to power failure and the remainder to equipment problems here and at the Force Logistics Command Message Center.

4. Wire Section: The wire section maintained the security loop and manned the security switch board on a twenty-four hour per day basis. Additionally, wire line to Americal Support was relaid providing better communication. A hot line linking FSR with Shop Stores and Electronics Maintenance Shop was installed. The lines in Supply Company area to the COC Bunker were reinstalled providing quicker trouble shooting, better communications and a neater appearance.
