

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month, FLSG-A continued to support Logistic Support Units One, Two and Three at An Hoa, Hill 55 and LZ Baldy respectively and Submit #1 at Chu Lai.

Due to roads closing to An Hoa and LZ Baldy because of heavy rains, supplies were airlifted to An Hoa and LZ Baldy.

Operation Pipestone Canyon is continuing to be supported by LSU's One and Two.

An unnamed operation began in LSU One An Hoa area during the latter part.... of the month.

Support of 2nd CAG began near the end of the month, to be implemented during the month of November.
